RARE INSTINCT.

The Wonderful Performances of a Cincinnati Dog. A remarkable story is told of a dog—a pointer—owned by a gentleman in Cincinnati, who three times gave him away to friends at some distance from the city, only to find him back again, case through a blinding snow-storm, very shortly after his abandonment.

It was resolved to experiment with him, in order to test the fact whether this was the result of memory or of some keenly-developed scent or other sense not known. He was accordingly dressed with morphine and taken to a town in Kentucky, one hundred and fifty miles away. In twenty-eight hours he was at his master's door. An Indian Legend Accounting for the White Man's Superiority. Among the Seneca Indians there is a singular tradition regarding the white man's origin and superiority. They say that when the Great Spirit made the earth he made three men, all of whom were fair-complexioned, and that after making them he led them to the margin of a small lake, and he bade them leap in and wash. One obeyed, and came out of the water purified and better than before. The second hesitated a moment, during which time the water, agitated by the first man's motion, and when he leaped became a copper color. The third did not leap in till the water became black with mud, and he came out as such. When the Great Spirit led them to the water, he gave them three packages, and, out of pity for the misfortune of color, gave the black man first choice. He took half of each of the packages and, having felt their weight, chose the heaviest, the copper-colored chose the next heaviest, leaving the white man the lightest. When the packages were opened the first was found to contain spades, hoes and all the implements of labor, the second wrapped hunting, fishing and warlike apparatus, the third gave the white man pens, ink and paper—the engines of the mind, the means of mutual improvement, the social link of humanity, the foundation of the white man's superiority.—Waterbury American.
