

THE MARRIAGEABLE AGE.

According to Darwinian Law, the ages are eighteen for males and fifteen for females.

In Spain, Portugal and Greece the limits are the same—fourteen and twelve—and in Switzerland the legal ages are such that the ages vary from fourteen to twenty for males and twelve to eighteen for the female sex.

Russia has a law making eighteen and sixteen the legal ages of the sexes in which the couple reside prior to their marriage six months prior to the limits quoted.
