The court martial trying Colonel Compton, of the 4th U.S. Cavalry, steps to prevent the hanging of a gambler at Walla Walla by soldiers of his command, found him guilty and some time ago forwarded its findings to the president. On Monday of last week the chief excentive passed upon the records of the trial and approved the proceedings. The punishment inflicted is suspension from rank and command on half pay for two years.

When Columbus was made a prisoner in San Domingo the gov ernor who arrested him feared there might be an attempt at rescue. So he trained a big gun on par the entrance of the citadel, or cas 1891 tle, in which Columbus was confined. That cannon has lain in the same place ever since until now, when Mr. Ober, a world's fair representative; recovered it, and with the permission of the governor of San Domingo, brought it to the United States. It has been shipped to Chief of Construction Burnham in order that he may use it in some way in ornamenting the exposition grounds.
