Joseph Barton, formerly superintendent of the S. V. Railway company, has many a good word to say for interior Oregon. Nor is Mr. Barton a recent convert to the plan to settle this part of the state simply because he is connected with a transportation line. While occupying his office with the railway people it was generally recognized that he was very favorable to exploitation and development of this neglected part of the state. May his good words and good works bear fruit to the advantage of the Great Interior.

It is being recognized more and more that neither perishable nor small profit tonnage can be handled from this part of the country with the present means of transportation. Fruit and ore should in the nature of things constitute the bulk of the value for Grant county products, but cattle and wool form almost the only revenue producing freights from here. This would be an ideal country for small fruit farms and orchards, and for apples its equal is probably not to be found on the coast.

The presence of a corps of federal forest officers and scientific stock inspectors in our very midst is one compensation for the involuntary relinquishment of public lands for reserve purposes. It is a great advantage to local stockmen, and will save much loss.

**PINE BUILDING STONE**

Building Stone in Large Quantities Found in Northern Grant.

The Pilot Rock Record says of the resources of the John Day country, that rich territory of northern Grant county lying tributary to Pendleton:

Among the undeveloped resources of the John Day country is a superior quality of sand stone that would be found of great value in the construction of buildings. A sample of the stone was brought to the Record office this week by L. G. Bogard from the middle fork of the John Day, and Mr. Bogard says the rock is to be found by the hundreds of tons on his farm and all along the banks of the John Day. It is the same quality of rock used in the outer walls of the new Methodist church in Pendleton and

shipped to that town from Union county. The rock becomes exceptionally light after being exposed to the sun. The sample to the Record office, 16x8 inches, does not weigh ten pounds and is as easily cut in two as a piece of wood.

There is no doubt but what this immense deposit of rock would have a commercial value with a railroad into that country.

**WOOL SALES**

Grant County People Sell at Last of Sales at Heppner.

The last of the wool sales for this season occurred in Heppner last Friday, says the Gazette.

**HARNEY COUNTY CLOSED**

District Attorney McCulloch Insists on Sunday Closing in Harney.

It is understood, says the Harney County News, that District Attorney McCulloch, in harmony with the general sentiment indicated by the vote on June 1st, will insist upon compliance with the laws of the state, by closing saloons on Sunday, putting a stop to all gambling and selling of liquor to miners, drunkards and intoxicated persons, and that an order to that effect is now in the hands of the sheriff of Harney county. This order will be in line with the policy of the Burns city council and will probably meet public approval in all parts of Harney county.
