In accordance with its regular custom, the Southern Pacific has issued from its General Freight Department a list of marketable products along its lines, which can be had for shipment.

There are 686 tons of hay on sale, distributed among these stations: Hillsboro, Roseburg, Junction City, Darry, Wilbur, Albany, Marion, Turner, Corvallis, Independence and Cornelius.

There are 121,000 lbs of a Woodburn, Oakland and Whitson, and 25 carloads of tile at McMinnville.

There is a large amount of vegetables ready for market. Of seed peas there are 20 sacks at Hillsboro; 8 cars of potatoes at Hillsboro; 9 cars at McMinnville and Hubbard; 700 sacks of potatoes at Hillsboro.
