It begins to look as though trouble is about to brew between the Portland Millmen's Union and their employers, al-

Millmen's Union and their employers, although the latter are confident that the matter will be amiliably settled.

The men have recently effected a strong organization, and it is understood that they intend to demand 10 hours, pay for nine hours, labor.

To avert this move being taken the millmen have offered an increase of 25 cents in the wages of the employes. Whether this will prove effective or not and gain the desired result remains to be seen.

The milimen claim that by meeting this demand of the men would prove disastrous to them, as they now are abliged to compete with all the other Coast milis at the same number of hours and scale of wages now in vogte here.

Just what the milimen propose to do has not vet been decided. They are reticent about giving ou anything for publication. They meet every Wednesday evening and it is known that the subject is discussed in all its various phases, and that some decisive plan of action will be agreed upon soon.

The employers seem disposed to do anything reasonable to the wart trouble. They thing reasonable to thwart trouble.
