**REPUBLICAN LOVE.
FEAST IN SAN JOSE**

SAN JOSE, Cal., April 14.—The convention of the California State League of Republican Clubs in session here is the largest meeting ever held by the organization. Two thousand delegates and visitors, representing Republican organizations throughout the state, filled the big agricultural pavilion when Pres. Fred Aiden Anderson of Susan called the gathering to order at 10 o'clock this morning. In calling the convention to order President Anderson congratulated the delegates on the large attendance and referred to the fact as an omen of Republican success at the polls this autumn. After addresses of welcome had been delivered and responded to the session was given over to routine business. Committees on credentials, order of business and organization were appointed, tad while they were preparing their reports the convention listened to brief impromptu speeches from several party leaders.

The convention will be in session two days, during which time plans will be discussed for the fall campaign and arrangements perfected for the strengthening of the organization throughout the state. Governor Gage, Duncan McKinley and other leaders will deliver speeches and altogether the gathering promises to be the most notable pow-wow and love-feast ever held by the Republicans of California.
