LOCAL MARKETS. Wheat fell off a cent in sympathy with the Chicago market which reached the lowest price of the season yesterday.

According to advices received from New York 20 to 25 cents a pound has been offered for hops in that state and as there is a natural difference of about 4 cents between the prices there and in Oregon, well-posted authorities predict a 25-cent rate on Oregon contracts with the possibility of a higher figure.

The best California Crawford peaches of the season came in this morning to a prominent front-street house, and are selling freely at a little lower price.

FISH OF UNCERTAIN TEMPER.

Sometimes Mere Irritation Leads Them to Seize the Lure.

Now and then an incident occurs going to show that certain old fish, infirm in temper though not in muscle, strike at the lure and get themselves into trouble because they are irritated by the presence of the lure, not that they are hungry.

If an angler can catch an old bass or trout or muskallunge lurking under a root or shelf or bunch of weeds, and remain himself hidden, he can generally tease it into attacking the bait by persistently breaking its rest or solitude.
