LOCAL MARKETS. Considering the usual Saturday quiet a very good volume of business is being transacted on Front street this morning in fruits and produce. Prices are maintained, and no material fluctuations are expected scon.

Columbia River salmon has been advanced 5 cents a dozen cans, accounted for by the shortage of the Sockeye pack on Puget Sound which last year amounted to some 3,000,000 cases and this season will not average 900,000 cases.

Threshing which has been in progress in Eastern Oregon and the Palouse (Washington) country for two weeks is just commencing in the Willamette Valley. Small quantities of oats have been received but no wheat as yet from that section. In fact very little is expected for export in bulk, most of the grop being used for local consumption, and by the mills for foreign shipment in the form of flour. The new tariffs on grain in which a reduction averaging 10 per cent is made from Dastern Oregon and Washington to Portland, were distributed this morning and extend further East than was expected, reaching from Squally Hook east. The rate on wheat and barley from Coast points to St. Paul, Duluth and Minneapolis is also reduced to per

The coffee market in New York has declined on Brazil grades as predicted several days ago. The market on mild grades of every sort, both in San Francisco and New York, remains firm with prices advancing owing to scarcity and the continuation of revolutions in Venezuela and Colombia.




