

### LAZARUS HAS RETURNED

Says That the Government Has an Eye on Portland.

### THE POSTOFFICE ALTERATIONS

Eastern Capital Looks to the West for Investment.

Edgar M. Lazarus, the local government architect, has returned from a five weeks' trip to New York, Washington and Baltimore. While at Washington, Mr. Lazarus saw Mr. Taylor, the supervising architect of the United States government regarding the proposed alterations to the Portland post office. In an interview Mr. Lazarus said:

"The bill for the addition of \$200,000 to the appropriation made by Congress states that for the United States post-office and court house at Portland, Oregon from \$404,865.74 to \$604,865.75, for the purpose of enlarging said building so as to make the same suitable for the further accommodation of the postoffice and United States courts which continue therein.

"About 118 public building bills were passed at the last session of Congress. It will be some little while before the Portland building can be taken up, al-

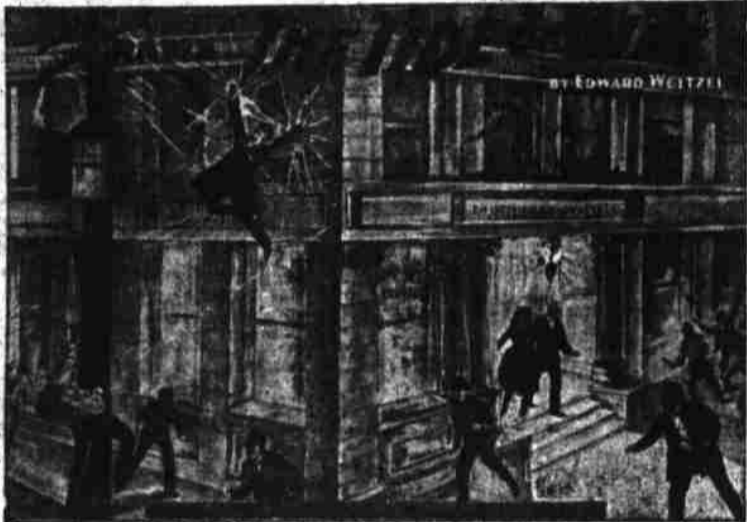

though the supervising architect realizes the urgent necessity of action being taken in connection with these improvements, as we visited the building together in Mr. Taylor's visit to Portland about a year ago, and it was on the strength of his recommendation that the Secretary of the Treasury indorsed the improvements.

"The intention is that after completing the wing to move the working force of the building into this addition and

back from 6 to 12 months owing to the impossibility of procuring the necessary structural metal.
