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MARKETS OF THE WORLD

CHICAGO, Sept. 8.-Chicago Record-Herald: The wheat market was quiet, because there were still unfavorable conditions of the spring wheat territory early last week and because the movement to market was about half last year's.

Wheat prices advanced 2 to 3 cents over the low point of 10 days ago. Just before the close of the week the weather suddenly settled and there were signs of a rush to market, half the wheat, lot 7, block 46, Portland City, \$22,000.

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
