I started to run sheep in 1863 in Umpqua Valley, Southern Oregon. I carried on the business there till 1875, when I came up here. My sheep are Merinos. I have about 10,000 head, most of which are leased out. I furnish the hay for winter feed and receive half the wool and half the increase.
