EASTERN OREGON

To Portland During the Oregon Irrigation Association Convention.

If Portland is not filled with visitors during the irrigation convention, which will be held here on November 18-19, it will not be the fault of the railroad companies or the committees arranging for the convention.

By request of the transportation committee of the citizens' general committee for the entertainment of the visitors to the convention, the O. R. & N. has written to Salt Lake asking the Oregon Short Line to make a rate between Huntington and Ogden, Utah, so that those interested in irrigation in those districts can attend the convention in Portland at little cost.

James M. Moore, secretary of the Oregon Irrigation Association, is around arranging for a hall for the convention and for badges for the delegates. It is very hard to get a suitable hall, as it must be very large. The probability is that the A. O. U. Hall will be rented for the occasion.
