HEATON JURY IS EXAMINING CASE. Murder Trial Will Soon Be On. News Notes From Eugene.

EUGENE, Nov. 5.-The jury in the trial of Bert Heaton for murder was secured today as follows: J. B. Taylor, W. L. Thompson, Charles Culbert, H. Hunter, W. B. Mumme, V. Heimanway, R. McMurphy, H. A. Kompf, J. M. Martin, Percy Long, George Holland, James Kinlerly.

W. L. Gilham of Portland, and Miss Millie Mack of Eugene, were married here today by Rev. H. A. Green.

A syndicate consisting of R. A. Booth, J. P. Kelley, and George H. Kelly, of Eugene; J. H. Booth of Roseburg; F. H. Bok, A. J. Hechtman, J. A. Chauster and Herbert Fleischner of San Francisco; Frank Miller, Adolph Helbron and H. A. Helbron of Sacramento, a majority of them being stockholders in the Booth-Kelly Lumber Company, have formed a company called the Oregon Land and Live Stock Company.

The new syndicate has charge of all the lands in the grant east of the Des Chutes River to the Idaho state line. They will begin operations next summer on a large scale. They will acquire lands adjacent to the grant and expect to reclaim a large amount of arid land by irrigation.

STOLE HIS CHILD. San Franciscan Arrested for Kidnaping at Victoria.

VICTORIA, B. C., Nov. 6.-Charged with the abduction of his own child, John M. Coleman is under arrest at this place. He was arrested yesterday upon the arrival of the steamer Umatilla, having left San Francisco but a few days before. When Coleman secured a divorce from his former wife in Victoria the child, a girl, was awarded her. The woman married again and Coleman enticed the child away from his home and then fled with it to British Columbia. The mother, with extradition papers, is now in Victoria and here to take action against her former husband.

A TEXAS WAR. FORT WORTH, Tex., Nov. 6.-In a general shooting affray at Orange yesterday Jeff Chenault, Sheriff Jordan and Tony Jones were killed. Will Harris, who started the row, escaped without injury. He met Chenault and began to abuse him. The latter threatened him with arrest, but did not take him into custody immediately. His neglect resulted in his death, for Harris at once went after a shotgun and killed Chenault at the first fire. General fighting followed, advocates of both sides joining in. Harris escaped in a buggy and is being pursued.
