ACROSS THE RIVER BACK FROM ALASKA PROGRAM PLANNED

Thomas Kay of Albina Returns From Golden North.
Arrangements Made for Soldiers' Bazaar Beginning Dec. 1.

According to Thomas Kay, former deputy United States collector of customs at Skagway, the mining business in that vicinity is panning out well.

Mr. Kay says: "I have just returned from a two-months' trip in the vicinity of Skagway, where I am interested in a number of mines and other business ventures."

"I look for a bright future for the City of Skagway. Although the town is not growing much at present, business in the town is quite lively."

"The mines are looking well and things are prosperous. They are located about three miles up the Skagway River, near a point called Porcupine Hill. There is some talk of putting in a smelter and a company is being formed mostly of local capital for that purpose."

"Several of the mines have been bonded for large sums and much development work is being done. The gold is of free milling quality and runs very well."

Mr. Kay was in Skagway when an unknown man came into the First National Bank and because the cashier refused to deliver up all the money, blew up the front of the building and himself.

"Crimes are very infrequent," concluded Mr. Kay, "on account of the difficulty in the criminals getting away. Shortly before I left for home, a couple of footpads held up a Juneau business man and secured several thousand dollars. The street at this point has been closed up for a number of years, but the city engineer has had the sidewalk barricaded for the past week."

One of the complaining residents claims that his sidewalk is better than that in front of the Southern Pacific depot, next door, around which no fence has been placed, and says if it is not removed from in front of his place that he will join hands with a number of others in the neighborhood and sue the city for damages.

CITY TO BE SUED. FOR HIGH SCHOOL

Business Men to Bring Action for Being "Fenced Up."

The City of Portland is likely to have to stand a suit for damages for the closing up of the sidewalks on East Washington street, between East Water and East First streets, when the Western Side is already crowded, most of the pupils being residents of the western section of town.

It is proposed by some of the prominent taxpayers of the city that the Board of Education utilize the block on East Third street, between East Stark streets and build a high school there.

R. L. Cate, who has large property interests on the East Side, says that the school should certainly be constructed, and it is likely that the Board of Education will be petitioned for that purpose.

TO FORM TRUST.

Fruitmen Will Attempt to Organize.

An effort will be made at a meeting called for Saturday afternoon, November 22, at Odd Fellows Hall, corner Grand avenue and East Pine street, to perfect the organization of the Fruitgrowers' Association.

The association was formed early this spring with H. C. Welch as president. At the time of the organization it was said that unless at least 75 per cent of the growers of this vicinity signed the charter rolls, the organization would not be effective.

If the promoters are successful in handling the fruitmen together they will attempt to force prices up by cornering the production.

Progress on East Morrison Street

Good progress is being made in the re-planning of East Morrison street, from Washington to East Water street. The work was started on the north side of the street at Union avenue and will be continued down to East Water street before taking up the south side. Street car or team traffic will not be molested.
