Residents on Twelfth street, between Washington and Clay, were treated to an illumination last night that enabled the blinded wayfarer to find the keyhole with an ease that astonished him.

The Welsbach Street Lighting Company of Philadelphia wishes to obtain a street lighting contract from the City of Portland and asked an opportunity to give an ocular demonstration of what their lights could do in the way of turning night into day.

The city, accordingly, has caused all other street lights in the district mentioned to be extinguished and the Welsbach Company has undertaken the service. The company has installed for the purposes of this exhibition 25 lights of 50 candlepower each, and also three large triple lamps which are each supposed to shed a light equal to 240 candles.

Many spectators were attracted to the vicinity last night by the unwanted display of radiance and a number of unofficial tests of the light were made. One gentleman, after adjusting his spectacles, calmly read aloud a paragraph from a copy of The Journal, and then announced that he could read better than in the daytime.

The Welsbach Company operates 13,000 lights in the City of St. Louis, Mo., and has over 5,000 on the streets of San Francisco, where they have proved to be eminently satisfactory.

The local authorities intend to make a thorough test of the various methods of street lighting before awarding any contracts, and it is improbable that any decision will be arrived at for some weeks.
