CHILD MEETS AWFUL DEATH

Little Girl Burned to Death at St. Helens.

(Journal Special Service.) ST. HELENS, Jan. 23.-Saturday morning Mrs. GAY of St. Helens, formerly Miss Stella Rowland, of Eugene, lost her little daughter of two years crawling about on the floor as she left the room. She was out of the room not to exceed two minutes, but a horrible sight met the mother's gaze on returning. By some means-it will never be known for a certainty-the baby's dress had caught fire and was in full blaze. The frantic mother extinguished the flames with a bedspread at hand, but it was too late. The child lived but four hours afterward, apparently not suffering to any great extent.

THE CASCADES TO BE REPAIRED

Will Be Used to Tow Logs Up the River.

The steamer Cascades, which was recently purchased from the government by the North Pacific Mill Company, has been taken to the Willamette Iron Works' dock for repairs. The company will use the steamer for towing logs up the river.

The Cascades was built by Joseph Paquet in 1882 at a cost, including work done by the government and outfit complete, of \$38,985. Her tonnage is 227.52; length, 150 feet; beam, 28 feet and 6 inches; depth of hold, 6 feet. Her boiler is the usual steamboat fire-box type, 24 feet and 3 inches long by 5 feet diameter, with 83 tubes. The steam dome is 12 feet and 4 inches by 4 feet diameter.
