WASHINGTON, Feb. 23.—Dewey's money case against the United States on behalf of himself and men in capture of Spanish vessels at Manila was decided in favor of Dewey today by the Supreme Court. In a case instituted by Sampson for prize money on Maria Teresa which was taken from Spanish but lost at sea while being brought to America, the Supreme Court rejected the libel. Brown and Brower entered, taking the ground that the men were entitled to the prize money for capture and it was not their fault that the vessel was lost while being brought in.

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
