All Is Not Joy With Former Portlander Acquitted of Murder.

Sidewalk Inspector's Visit Calls Was Accused With Three Others of Killing Marine Engineer at Scattle.

> James Tilton, well known in sporting circles in Portland, has been acquitted of the charge of murder in the first degree which has been hanging over his head in Seattle for several months He was charged with the murder of L. A. Booth, assistant engineer on the

> steamer Garonne. On September 14, Booth was knocked down and robbed in the Green Light saloon, a tough resort on Washington street, Scattle. Tilton, William Milfon and Frank Churchil, hangers-on, and William Levins, the night bartender, were arrested, and all were charged with murder, for after lingering several days in Providence Hospital Booth died.

> There was much evidence against the feer men. Roy Thornton, a driver in the employ of the Seattle Brewing and Malting Company, was rolling a keg of beer into the Green Light saloon when he saw Tilton deal Booth a hard blow on the forehead. Booth staggered and fell, after which, Thornton said, Tilton and three other men went through his pockets in a box of the saloon. Several other witnesses testified to the assault and robbery.

All Turned Loose.

The Tilton case was heard before Superior Judge William R. Bell, the man who issued the call for the King County Grand Jusy, which is now in session. The jury is said to have cast but one ballot, finding the defendant not guilty. Prosecuting Attorney Scott, over whom the grand jury has had so much trouble, owing to his white-washing tendencies, moved for the dismissal of the other three defendants, saying a conviction

could not be had on the evidence. James, Tilton and William Levins are well known in Portland. Both men formerly lived here and have numerous acquaintances here. They have very unenviable records, Tilton having been accused of murder here, and Levins being known as a consort of dissolute women. Both men were in continual trouble with the police, and the officers stated today that they sincerely hoped neither of the pair would come this way.

CORNELIUS VANDERBILT
