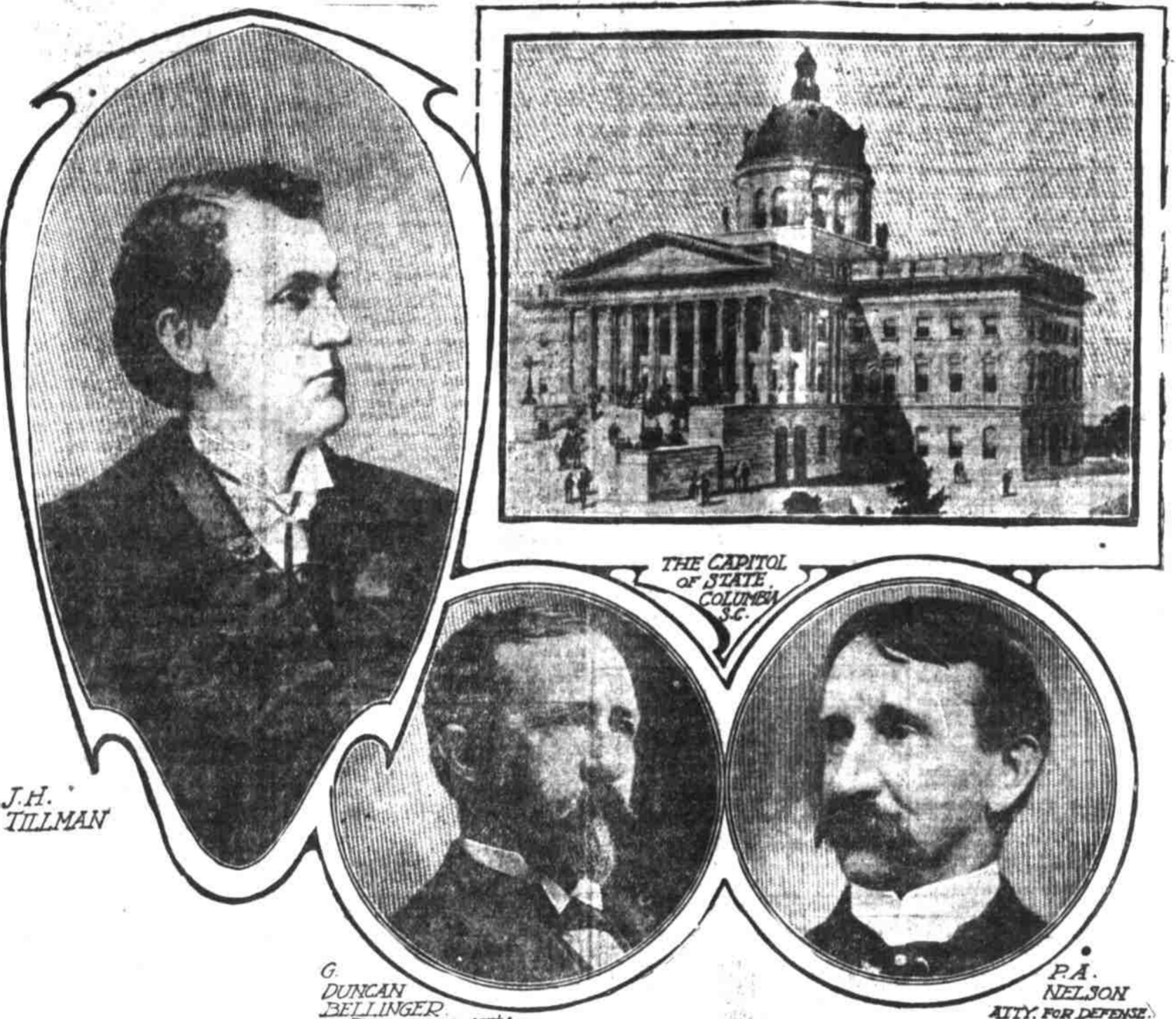
Don Juan Kastrioti Will Go to Albania.

(Journal Special Service.) PARIS, April 13.—Prince Don Juan d'Aladro Kastrioti believes that an at least partial solution of the Balkan question lies in making a monarch of Albania, with himself as occupant of its throne.

"On the death of King Alfonso XII, with whom I was closely acquainted, I retired from the diplomatic service and settled in Paris, where I was president of the international committee of Hispano-Flyrean Railways.

Not the least interesting part of Judge Rudolph's life is the fact that he was a personal friend of Abraham Lincoln, whom he met in 1840. He was frequently associated with the man destined to become the great war President and knew him intimately for a number of years.

An incident that elicits to Mr. Rudolph's memory in connection with Lincoln is a fruitful source of amusement to the occasional auditors to whom the old man tells it. The future emancipator was trying a case in the Postville courthouse, and stopping in the midst of the proceedings, brought conterminous to court and spectators by suddenly pulling off his boot. Without more ado and seemingly unconscious of the astonished gaze directed upon him, he removed his sock, took a large jack-knife from his pocket and began deliberately trimming a troublesome corn. Glancing up a few moments later he read the look of startled indignation and offended dignity in his honor's countenance and met the court's rebuke by a humble apology.
