

SPokane Defeats Grim's Tossers

Fourteen Innings of Good Baseball

Fair Sized Crowd Witness the Nationals Play Their Initial Game

One and five-ninths games of baseball were played and concentrated were served up for the single price of admission at the Portland National grounds yesterday afternoon.

Portland lost. But then everybody knows that Portland is a good loser. Anyway, there is no disgrace attached to being last at the finish of a contest that endured through fourteen long innings and wound up with a display of fireworks that would have relegated a Chinese New Year celebration to the shadows of oblivion.

The score was 3 to 2 in favor of Spokane, but the score was only a trivial incident of the game itself. The man who draws a salary from Manager Grim for painting figures on a board in imitation of the result of innings, ran out of blackboard space and, after puzzling for a length of time that nearly drove the audience wild with apprehension, began all over again and wrote figures inside of those already constructed. The crowd had faint visions between innings of vanishing spectators and scorers waiting at the end of the return journey, but while the innings themselves were in progress there was no time for visions—the people were too busy watching the game.

The contest was as full of heart-throbs as a love match in Zanzibar, and from the time the first ball was pitched until "Big" Elsey smashed out the winning single in the fourteenth inning, it was tough and gay with both sides reaching the grand climax of public feeling was reached in the thirteenth, when, after Spokane had landed two voyagers in safety on the rubber, Portland succeeded in populating the pillows with two more. 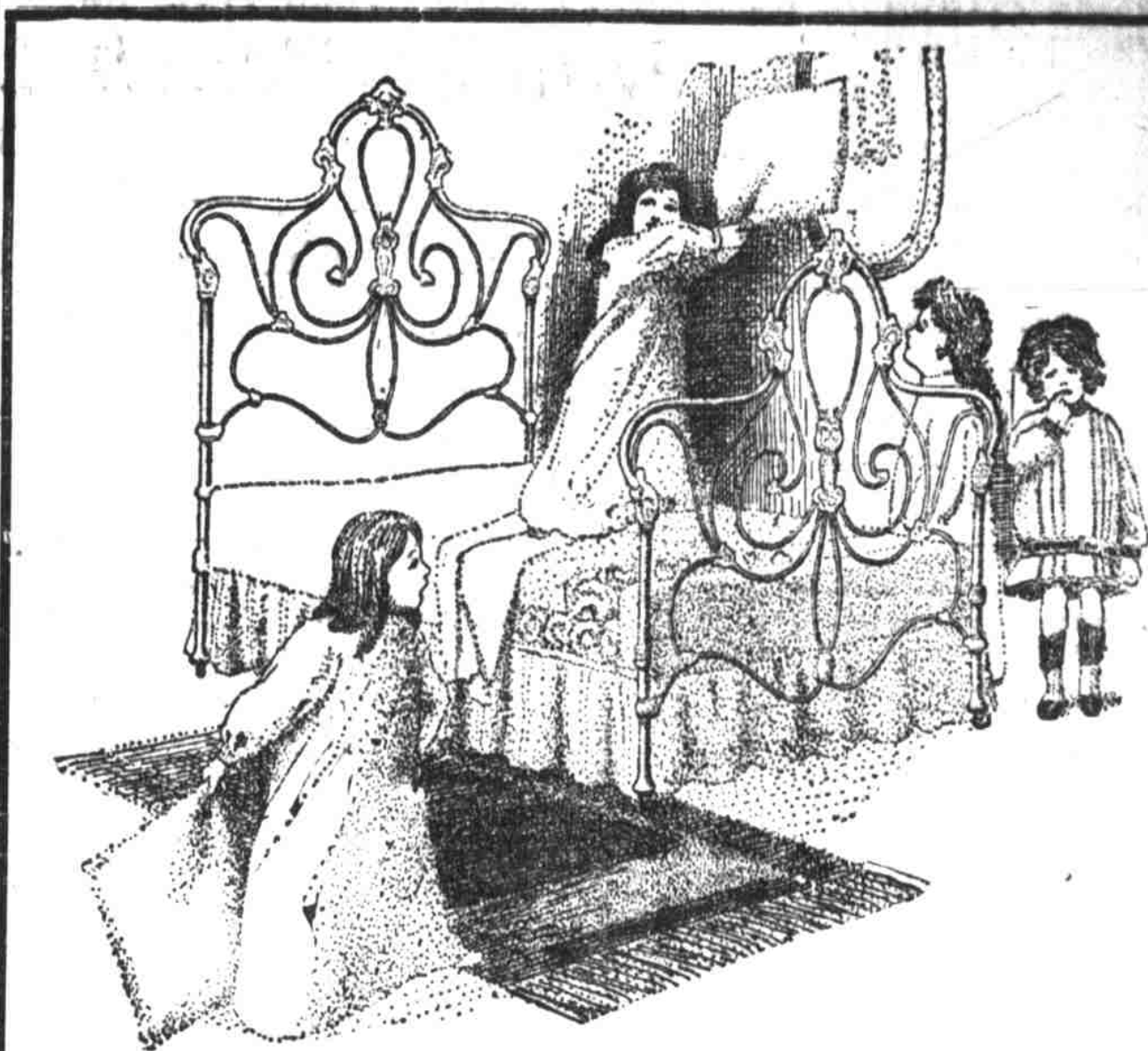

CLEVELAND ON NEGRO. (Journal Special Service.) NEW YORK, April 15.—Six President Cleveland was the principal speaker at the meeting tonight in the interests of the Tuskegee Normal and Industrial School.
