## RETURNS FROM SAN FRANCISCO

## R. H. McCallum Adjusted Labor Difficulty.

### Says That Portland Leather Factories Are Superior to Those of San Francisco.

R. H. McCallum, an officer of the International Leather Workers' Union, returned yesterday from San Francisco where he went to adjust some differences xisting between the local organization and the leather men. He reports that his trip was entirely successful, and a settlement was brought about upon practically the same terms as were given the Portland union several weeks ago. The important points were nine hours, and a minimum rate of wages of \$2.75 per day. Mr. McCallum says:

"These concessions were brought about with very little difficulty, and they mean a great deal to the employes. Many of them were working for much less pay than this amount. It is of particular benefit to the retail employes who did not enjoy a uniform wage scale. Now all of them get good wages, and some of them engaged on piece work are enabled to make as high as \$5 per day. Portland Leads.

"You will probably be surprised to learn that Portland has larger leather factories than San Francisco, and more en at work in them. It is true that

the union membership in the Bay City is 260, while here it is but 150, but this is easily explained. The most of the union men in the California metropolis are employed in the retail shops, but in Portland the opposite is true-they are nearly all in the factories. Why, one of the largest Portland factories turns out almost as many goods as all the factories in San Francisco combined. Another thing surprising is that the factorhere are thoroughly equipped with up-to-date machinery. In 'Frisco they use the same old machinery as was used years ago. Down there the firms are ealthy, and they evidently do not be lieve in expending money to keep up with the times.
