

REURNS FROM SAN FRANCISCO R. H. McCallum Adjusted Labor Difficulty.

Says That Portland Leather Factories Are Superior to Those of San Francisco.

R. H. McCallum, an officer of the International Leather Workers' Union, returned yesterday from San Francisco, where he went to adjust some differences existing between the local organization and the leather men. He reports that his trip was entirely successful, and a settlement was brought about upon practically the same terms as were given with Portland union several months ago.

The concessions were brought about with very little difficulty, and they mean a great deal to the employees. Many of them were unable to find work in San Francisco, and it is of particular benefit to the retail employees who did not enjoy a uniform wage scale. Now all of them get good wages, and some of them engaged on piece work are enabled to make as high as \$5 per day.

Portland Leads. 'You will probably be surprised to learn that Portland has leather factories than San Francisco, and more men at work in them. It is true that the union membership in the Bay City is 250, while here it is but 150, but this is easily explained. The most of the union is employed in the retail trade, but in Portland the opposite is true—they are nearly all in the factories. Why, one of the largest Portland factories turns out almost as many goods as all the factories in San Francisco combined.

Another thing surprising to many is that the leather here is thoroughly equipped with up-to-date machinery. In France they use the same old machinery as was used years ago. Down there the firms are wealthy, and they evidently do not believe in expending money to keep up with the times.

Another thing I know talking about, for I have lived in both places, is that the leather here is better than San Francisco leather. If all the business men would take concerted action they could make this the leading manufacturing city, in all lines, on the Pacific coast. It has every advantage in its favor.
