WHAT RAILROADS EARN

(Journal Special Service.)

NEW YORK, June 5.—Gross earnings of all railroads in the United States reported to the Interstate Commerce Commission for May date \$425,088,972, a gain of 12.8 per cent over last year and 25.6 per cent over 1913.

By classes of roads there is still increase in earnings on all grangers, trunk lines, now including the West-
