

ONE OF WORST IN THIS CITY

Circuit Judge Frazer Declares That "Chick" Houghton Is in the Van When It Comes to Criminal Acts.

Refused to Grant a New Trial to the Man Twice Convicted of Robbery—Bail Is Fixed at Highest Limit.

"Chick" Houghton, by the statement of Circuit Judge Arthur L. Frazer, is not only guilty of robbing Steve Balch, but is one of the worst criminals in the city of Portland.

"In granting this, however," said Judge Frazer, "I believe I am working a hardship upon both Houghton and his parents."

Houghton has been at liberty pending the decision of the court, on bail, in the sum of \$1,500, and when Judge Frazer announced his intention of raising it to the limit, strong objections were raised by the defense.

Houghton was tried and convicted of holding up and robbing Steve Balch. He was sentenced to serve eight years in the penitentiary.

A new trial was asked for the last time on the grounds that an error was made in allowing the witness to take the witness stand.

E. W. Liberty, assault with a dangerous weapon. On May 17 Liberty is accused of stabbing B. L. Redden.

STABLEMEN SETTLE STRIKE TROUBLES

Returned to Work Monday Without Any Concessions From the Bosses.

The Stablemen's Union, comprising a membership of 70, voted to return to work at their regular meeting held on Monday evening.

When the strike started there were seventy-four men walked out. Of this number it is said that thirty-five or forty have left the city and have found employment elsewhere.
