Col. R. W. Mitchell held this office under Governor Penney's administration.

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SCARCITY OF HELP DELAYS ROAD WORK

Oregon Water Power Line Toward Stillwater Finished as Far as Barton.

Scarcity of labor has so delayed work on the extension of the Oregon Water Power & Railway Company's line to Stillwater, 40 miles southeast of Portland, that the road will not be finished until some time after September.
