

OFFICE NOT YET AWARDED

Question of Appointment of Successor to John Hall One of Great Importance in Oregon District.

Although State Delegation Is in Session Here Today It Is Not Thought Probable Choice Will Result.

Senators Fulton and Mitchell Are Firm for Their Respective Candidates and Speculation Is Rife.

"We are in Portland to meet with the Lewis and Clark Fair Commissioners and not to discuss either politics or political preference. The Oregon delegation of the National Congress is actuated, on the occasion of its gathering today, purely by motives of public importance and nothing of a private nature will enter into the business transacted."

The above statement was made with practical unanimity by the Oregon senators and representatives who are in this city today and who declaim with one accord that no question of appointment will come up for adjustment. That the matter will not be discussed they do not say, but they do contend that if there is agitation of this subject it will be as individuals and not as members of the Oregon delegation that they will take part in it.

But with the question of the successor of United States District Attorney John Hall still unsettled a gathering of the Oregon delegation cannot fail to attract attention and result in considerable conjecture.

Many Candidates Out. Candidates for appointive offices were traveling in droves about the Portland Hotel this morning and senators and representatives alike were being but-tressed and interrogated at every turn.

Senator Charles W. Fulton arrived from Astoria last night and took apartments at the Hotel Portland, breakfasting with Senator John H. Mitchell this morning. Congressman J. N. Williamson of Prineville is at the Imperial and at the same hostelry Congressman Binger Herman is quartered.

In the presence of a party of friends Senators Mitchell and Fulton indulged in a sharp burst of repartee this morning in regard to the claim of their respective candidates for the position of United States District Attorney for Oregon.

Senator Mitchell favors Judge J. C. Moreland of the city, and Senator Fulton has announced himself as strongly in favor of George C. Brownell, whom he holds as his benefactor and the man whose shrewd political management enabled Mr. Fulton to win the high office he now occupies.

The senators were sitting together on the Hotel Portland veranda in pleasant conversation when a bystander asked Senator Fulton if the matter of the District Attorney appointment had not been decided upon.

Fulton Asks Mitchell. "How about the case?" Senator Fulton asked, turning toward his colleague. "Is it true that you have decided to endorse my man? If so, the thing is all settled."

Senator Mitchell smiled and replied: "The district attorneyship problem will be solved just as soon as you come over to my view, Senator." Then, looking about him in a fatherly way, Senator Mitchell continued:

"You see, Charles, you cannot hope to get it all. It is hardly right for a youngster to come suddenly into a position of importance and expect to sweep the chessboard. You should be content with a little and not try to be hogish."

Senator Fulton was ready with his reply. "That is not the way to look at it at all," he said. "You have been in power for years and have had your share. You ought not to try to keep everything for yourself, but should be willing to divide up with a friend. Anyway, it is not personal greed for power, but the greatness of my cause which inspires me to persevere in the matter of the appointment of District Attorney."

Senators Are Intimate. After this friendly tilt the senators linked arms and headed for the smoking room, running the gauntlet of gathered office-seekers.

It is held by the friends of W. W. Banks of Portland, who is said to have been promised the deputy attorneyship in return for assisting Fulton to don his toga, that the selection of Judge Moreland instead of Mr. Brownell would not injure Mr. Banks' chances in the least. Banks and Brownell are both Fulton men, but the possibility of an agreement is admitted, although it is not deemed probable that Senator Fulton would willingly "turn down" Brownell, to whom he has publicly acknowledged his debt.

HOURS ARE REDUCED FOR TEN TO NINE

Upholsterers and Carpet Men in Employ of Tull & Gibbs Given a Surprise.

About the happiest wage-earners in the city today are the upholsterers and carpet-layers who are in the employ of Tull & Gibbs, the furniture dealers. Beginning today they will only have to work nine hours out of 24 instead of the 10 hours to which they have heretofore been accustomed. The reduction was voluntarily made on the part of the company.

All the other upholsterers in the city are working 10 hours a day. They have been insisting upon having a similar concession which they failed to secure. Whether the employees in the other houses will demand a nine-hour day or not remains to be seen. It is the opinion of many union men, however, that they will insist upon having a similar concession granted them at the same rate of pay they now receive, which is allowed to the Tull & Gibbs employees.

F. D. Gibbs, a member of the firm, was seen this morning and when asked for a statement said: "I do not care to advertise this matter. The reduction of hours was made, however, just in order to make the firm consistent. At our house in Spokane the employees are only required to work nine hours, and we thought it no more than right to do as well by the men here. It has been my experience that when an employe is satisfied he will do just as much work in nine hours as he will working an hour longer if he is dissatisfied."

NO SUCCESSOR TO COLVIG NAMED YET Senator Mitchell Secured Him the Place and May Make Another Selection.

The announcement today that G. W. Colvig had left his post as United States Consul to Colombia was a surprise to many here. Grants Pass occasioned considerable comment concerning the probable naming of his successor, a matter that will fall to the Oregon delegation.

Mr. Colvig received his appointment through Senator Mitchell, to whom he swung the whole of Binger Herman's following in the Senatorial contest of 1901. It has been known for some time that Colvig was dissatisfied with his present appointment and would not remain in Grants Pass. In view of the fact that Senator Mitchell owes him so much it is deemed not impossible that Colvig will be privileged to name his own successor.

In an interview this morning both Oregon Senators stated that nothing was being considered at today's gathering relative to appointments. That being the case, it is understood that Mr. Colvig's successor has not been selected.

TO LEVY ASSESSMENT The ways and means committee of the Lewis and Clark Fair directors will meet this afternoon at the Exposition headquarters to discuss the question of levying the third assessment on the stock of the corporation. It is thought that a motion will also be introduced at the meeting to give a souvenir pass to everyone of the shareholders who pays his or her subscribed stock up in full before a stated time in the near future; some think that November 1 should be made the limit of time for those who wish to take advantage of this opportunity to get the passes.

Through his attorneys, Murdock & Moser, the Chicago man states that the actors stopped at his hotel, the St. Charles European, from January 1 to May 1 without paying their bills. The manager of the Empire has been garnished. It being thought that he may have some property in his keeping that belongs to the Budds.

TO CHANGE SHIFTS To The Editor Journal—Now that the Police Department has been divided into eight-hour shifts I would like to suggest to the chief that he have the day men report at 7 o'clock instead of 8:30, which is not unreasonable, and the first night relief would report at 3:30, instead of 5, and the second night relief at 11:15, instead of 12:45. This arrangement would allow the men who patrol far out to ride to and from the station and enable them to get to their beats much sooner on the late shift than under the present system. It would also give those going off duty a chance to ride home, whereas at present they are compelled to walk as the cars have stopped before they are off duty.

SUN SCORCHES EASTERN PEOPLE

Hospitals Are Crowded in New York City and More Than 17 Had Died by 3:30 O'clock This Afternoon.

Pittsburg Also Suffers from Terrible Wave of Humidity Which Extends as Far West as Missouri.

(Journal Special Service.) NEW YORK, July 10.—The terrible heat of the sun and the stagnant atmosphere of this great city is cutting men and women down on every side. Rich and poor are suffering alike and neither night nor day is there relief. At 3:30 o'clock this afternoon a total of 17 deaths had been reported as resulting from the torrid heat. The prostrations are so great that no accurate count of them can be kept and the emergency hospitals are filled.

Reports from all points indicate the death list will total much higher before night, as the weather is constantly growing hotter. Last night was the hottest recorded here since 1878. The temperature began today at 80 and has steadily crawled until it is near the 100 mark this afternoon.

It may be that the by-laws will be so amended that in the future the auditor may be one of the corporation's paid officials.

It is thought that the executive committee of the corporation will be instructed to confer with the co-operative committee of the state commission in order that there may be a better understanding between the two boards regarding matters connected with both the Lewis and Clark and the St. Louis Expositions.

RETAIL CLERKS WEAR BUTTONS

Beginning Tomorrow Each Member of the Union Will Have Little Red Buttons on His Coat Lapel.

Card System Has Been Done Away with, Because It Proved Unsatisfactory to Clerks and Patrons Alike.

Beginning tomorrow every retail clerk who is a member of the Union will wear upon the lapel of coat or dress-front a red button on which is printed in black letters the name of that labor organization. These colors will be used for three months after which some other colored buttons will be chosen for the ensuing quarter. It is the intention to select some different hued emblem to be worn during each quarter of the year.

The card system which has been in vogue ever since the Union was formed is to be done away with, as it is said to be very unsatisfactory to the clerks and patrons of the several stores alike.

Many customers, it is explained, will not purchase goods unless union clerks wait upon them, and when patrons were not personally acquainted with the employees back of the counter there was nothing remaining to be done but to request them to show their cards. To many this proved a very embarrassing ordeal. Oftentimes the clerks did not have the cards to exhibit, and as a consequence they were passed by with a stony stare.

Discovery Made. After considerable worry and cogitation a way out of the unhappy predicament was finally discovered. As soon as the button substitution was suggested it met with popular favor, and arrangements were made for the adoption of the plan. Members of the Union believe that the new system will be the means of getting many of the non-union clerks into the organization. Heretofore, it is said, some of them have been in the habit of borrowing cards from among their friends, but this plan will not be tolerated under the button administration of affairs. It will go no good to "whoop the button" unless a person is entitled to wear it.

War on Unfair Shops. A permanent organization of the North End Barbers' Protective Association has been formed with Joseph Jones as president and W. A. O'Rourke as secretary. The object of the Association is to formulate some plan to operate against the business interests of the unfair barber shops in Portland. The Association is composed of both proprietors and journeymen. No mode of procedure has yet been decided upon, but it is stated to be highly probable that pickets will be stationed at the unfair shops to secure the names of those who patronize them.
