MAYOR WILL DEMAND ENTIRE JUSTICE

HEADQUARTERS MOVE

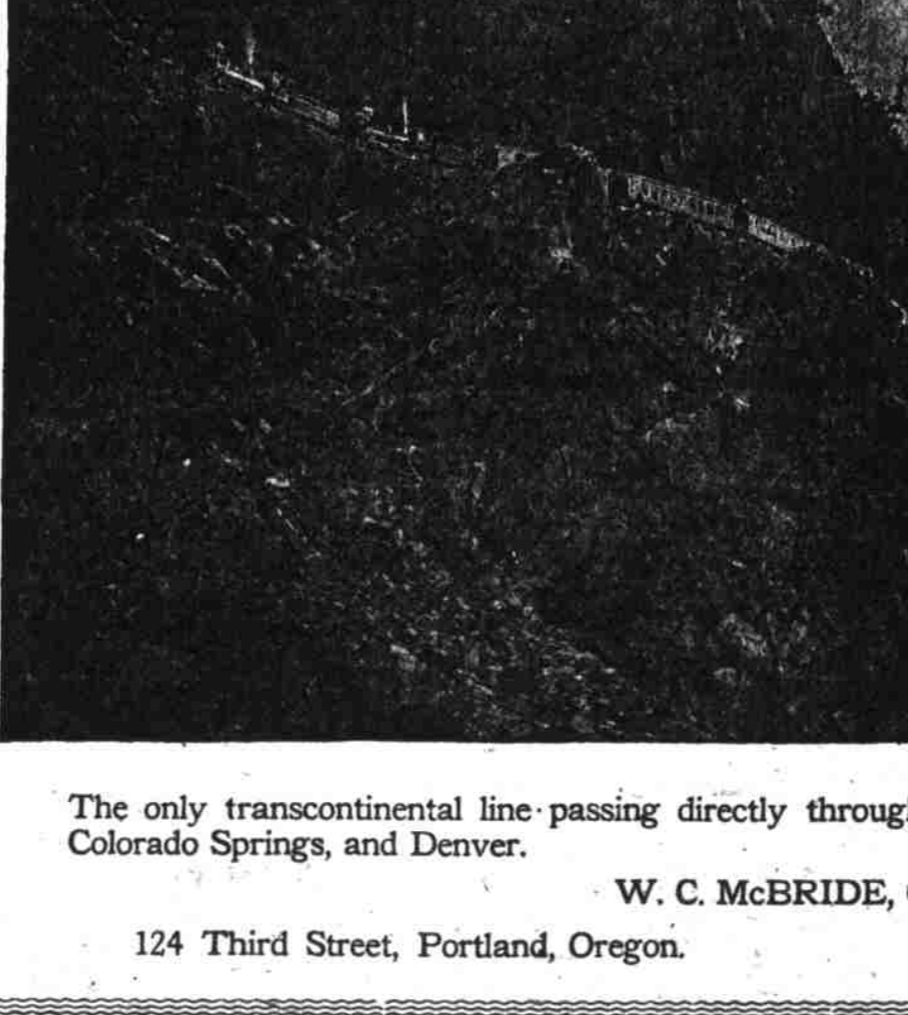
The headquarters of the Chamber of Commerce will be moved this week into the new rooms now being fitted up in the Mohawk Building.
