STATUTE OMITTED FROM THE CODE

No Mention Made by Bellinger & Cotton to Law Permitting Counties to Work the Prisoners.

Discovery Made by an Attorney Who Was Preparing to Begin an Injunction Suit.

In closely inquiring into the right of the County Court to compel prisoners to work on the rockpile, Ex-United States District Attorney Dan R. Murphy made the discovery yesterday that reference to any statute granting such right to the court is made in the Bellinger & Cotton code. The code was compiled and annotated and supposed to contain all the laws of the state up to the year 1901. But it makes no mention of the statute of 1899 which permits counties to work their prisoners.

The statute of 1899, which permits counties to work their prisoners, was passed by the Legislature in 1899, and United States District Judge Bellinger and W. W. Cotton, general attorney for the O. R. & N., completed their work on the code about three years later.

Can't Get Their Client Out. The discovery was made by Mr. Murphy after the closest investigation of the statutes of the State. Sweet & Watts, of which he is the senior member, had been retained to secure the release of a prisoner who had been sent out to work on the rockpile, and to secure an injunction restraining the county from compelling its prisoners to do the same.

Mr. Murphy immediately undertook the case and in looking over the code he found that section 145 of it, which was passed in 1899, provided that the prisoners should be imprisoned in the county jail, and under its terms the County Court could not force them to do any work. The attorney was certain that a later law had been passed, but failed to find it in the code.

After reading the law Mr. Murphy advised his client not to bring suit, unless he wished to test the constitutionality of the law. He had already learned a lesson regarding high prices. If feed prices jump the demand will fall off.

Kansas City is High. The Kansas City market has again been placed upon a basis where it is worse than the other markets, so far as the fat cattle question is concerned. The packers have the markets regulated so nicely that no shipper can make money by buying in the Kansas city yards and shipping to St. Louis or Chicago. Kansas City packers have been paying almost as much for cattle as the packers have in Chicago. This has been due to the demand, of course. However, with the heavy crop raising season it is doubtful if it is best to advise shippers to this city at this time.

PACKERS DECIDE TO DROP PRICES

Combination in All the Larger Centers to Force Cattle Quotations Lower—Finished Product Will Stay.

Stocks at Kansas City Are Already \$1 Lower Than the Previous Year—Sheep Trade Is Fairly Active.

KANSAS CITY, Mo., Aug. 21.—In livestock circles in all the cities of the Central West—that is, the stockyards centers, Chicago, Omaha, Kansas City, St. Joseph and St. Louis—is heard continually the statement that the packers have decided to force the price of cattle down in all the several yards. The commission men say, and they are upheld by the big shippers, that it looks as if the combine had united on the policy of steadily forcing the market down to the place where the profits on feeding cattle and raising them will be cut in two and the packers' profits doubled. Of course the consumer of beef is not to have a reduction in the price he pays for his steak—at least that is not the way the packers who control the situation figure it.

Cattle Now Selling 11 Lower than they were a year ago when the top notch was reached and when the cattle raisers were congratulating themselves. How much lower the market is to fall the question that is bothering the men who are well stocked up on ranches. Of course the decline in the feeder and stocker market is another thing. While it is not helpful to the Kew River raiser, it is still it helps the feeder of cattle, and not the packer.

It is the general opinion that feeders and stockers have been too high for a long time, considering the value of fat calves. The man who raises the calves, it is asked a year ago for feeders and has made money has been the exception, and not the rule in the cattle business. According to the present outlook, if corn keeps on showing gains there should be a fall in the price of feed.
