

COMMITTEE VOTE LIKELY TO STAND

EMPIRE CONSTRUCTION COMPANY'S REQUEST FOR A TELEPHONE FRANCHISE PROBABLY WILL BE TURNED DOWN BY THE CITY COUNCIL AT ITS NEXT MEETING.

Three-Fourths of the Members of that Body Said to Be Bitterly Opposed to a Second Company—The People Back of the Scheme Will Not Give Up Their Attempt to Establish Their Business Here.

While the action of the street committee yesterday in recommending the indefinite postponement of the Empire Construction company's request for a telephone franchise practically kills the bill for the present time, the people representing the proposition have not given up the fight by any means.

This is the second time that this same company has been turned down on their franchise proposition. About eight months ago they had the same request up, but the council by a big majority vote refused the petition.

Mr. Stowe was present yesterday and in the interest of his people made quite a play upon the petitions before the committee. This had no effect, however, the members claiming that people who had signed the petition had come to them afterwards and stated that they did so just to get rid of the solicitors.

"Well, we want to know who of the council members are against the petition," said Mr. Stowe, "and I want you to return it with a recommendation to kill it. Then it will come up for a second call and we can see who are for and who against it."

PLOT AGAINST THE MOTHER OF ALFONSO

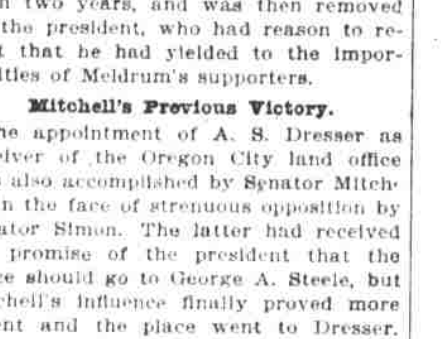

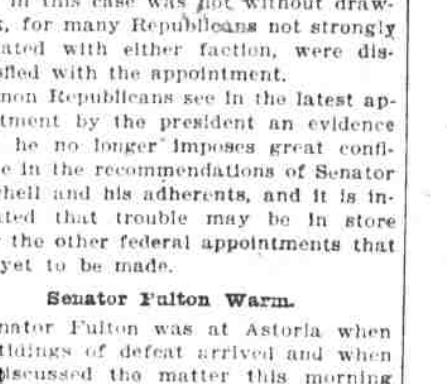
MITCHELL AND HIS MEN WILL EAT THEIR CROW

COURT INDORSES POLICE LAXITY

ANY LATITUDE ALLOWED IN OBEYING THE SALOON-CLOSING ORDINANCE RESTS WITH THE LAW GUARDIANS, SAYS MUNICIPAL JUDGE HOGUE.

Imposes Light Fine on a Saloon-Keeper Who Explained His Violation of the Law By Saying that He Had a Special Agreement With the Police to Keep Open After Hours Only Technical Violation of Ordinance.

In the police court this morning Judge Hogue imposed a fine of \$25 upon Joseph Clark for keeping his saloon at Third and Everett streets open after hours. An additional fine of \$10 was ordered for using abusive language to Police Captain Bailey.

Attorney W. T. Hume appeared for the defendant, and said that although there had been a technical violation of the closing ordinance, there were extenuating circumstances. It could be proved, he said, that there was an understanding with the police that if the front door was locked at 1 a. m., the saloon could be kept open after that, permission having been given to keep the side entrance open.

Judge Hogue stated that the allowing of any latitude in the observance of the ordinance rested with the police department, and not with the judge. He was satisfied that there had been no intentional or deliberate attempt made to break the law, but as the ordinance had been broken, it was necessary to find the defendant guilty.

The court also referred to the case of Michael Bradley, who was fined \$25 yesterday for keeping his place open. Bradley had claimed that he remained at the place all night to keep company with a friend who was afraid to go home because of the danger of being held up. This also was a technical violation, and the lowest fine was imposed.
