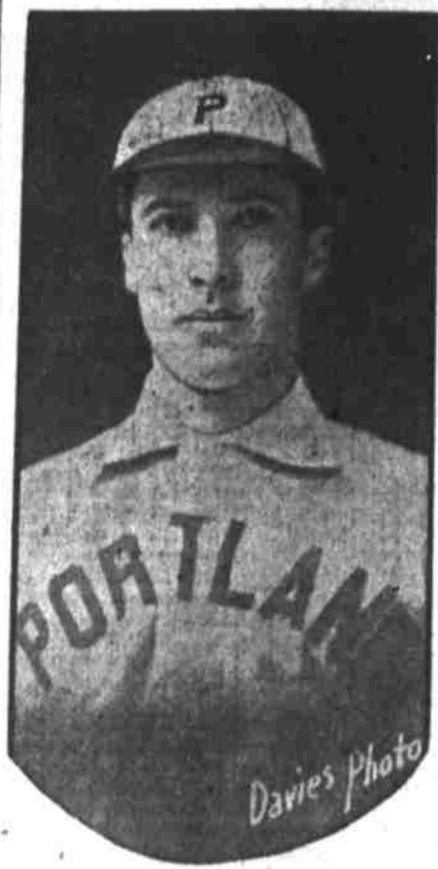

FOND MOTHER GETS HER CHILD BACK. Spokane, Wash., Oct. 13.—Through having her child returned to her yesterday, after they had been kidnaped from her on a bleak Wyoming ranch 17 years ago, Mrs. M. Richards of Lind, Wash., is the happiest woman in the state.

The mother got the first trace of the children in the 17 years of their absence when she learned that William and Maud Fitzgerald, a young man and woman living at Fruitland, had been taken in their infancy and brought to the then territory of Washington.

Without any delay the mother began a correspondence in the faint hope of strengthening the clue. The responses that she received caused the first glimmer of hope that she had of ever seeing the children again to revive and she went to Fruitland, where the identification was made complete.

It developed that the children had been raised in Spokane and Waterville, in fact, the daughter had gone back to Spokane when the mother arrived at Fruitland, and the latter at once took the train for Spokane. She met the daughter in the latter city on Thursday and the restoration was made complete.

Neither of the children knew their mother, but after looking intently at their faces for a few minutes, she recalled the features of their childhood and with joy realized that there could be no mistake. Other features connected with the identification was regarding the ranch on which they were born in Wyoming and when each of the young people remembered sufficiently to describe from a topographical standpoint.

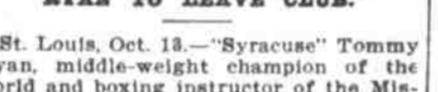

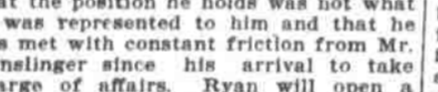
