PROPOSED IMPROVEMENT OF E.
EIGHTH STREET.

Notice is hereby given that at the meeting of the council of the city of Portland, Oregon, held on the 7th day of October, 1910, the following resolution was adopted:

Resolved, That the council of the city of Portland, Oregon, deems it expedient and proper to improve East Eighth street from north line of Falling street to the south line of Jackson street, in the following manner, to-wit:

First—By grading the street full width to conform to the established grade.

Second—By constructing wooden sidewalks in accordance with the city engineer's specifications and estimates.

Fourth—By constructing box gutters.

Said improvement to be made in accordance with the charter and ordinances of the city of Portland and the plans, specifications and estimates of the city engineer filed in the office of the auditor of the city of Portland on the 26th day of September, 1903, in accordance with "City engineer's plans and specifications for the improvement of East Eighth street from north line of Failing street to the south line of Mason street and the estimates of the cost of the same," and the probable total cost of the same.

PROPOSED IMPROVEMENT OF YAMHILL STREET.

Notice is hereby given that at the meeting of the council of the city of Portland, Oregon, held on the 7th day of October, 1903, the following resolution was adopted:

Resolved, That the city engineer be and he do is authorized to prepare plans and specifications for the improvement of Yamhill street from Broadway to Commercial street, as follows:

Portland, Ore., deems it expedient and proper to improve Yamhill street from the line of Fourth street to the west line of Main street, in the following manner, to-wit:

First—By grading the street full width at all intersections, to the proper subgrade.

Second—By paving the street, full width at all intersections, with Bituminous Macadam Waterproof pavement.

Third—By constructing artificial stone curbs at the intersection of Seventh street with Yamhill street.

Fourth—By improving that portion of the street occupied by the Portland Railway.

Pfiftb—By constructing stone headers and setting the same in concrete to form a curb at intersection with the street, and for a distance of one foot on each side of the curb, to be made in accordance with the plans, specifications and ordinances of the city of Portland and the plans, specifications and ordinances of the city engineer.

estimates of the city engineer filed in the office of the auditor of the city of Portland on the fifth day of March, 1903. Indorsed: "The city engineer's plans and specifications for the improvement of Yamhill street from the west line of Fourth street to the west line of Chapin street, and estimates of the work to be done, and the probable total cost thereof." The cost of said improvement to be assessed as provided by the city charter, upon the property specially benefited thereby and which is hereby declared to be all the property lying between the north line of Yamhill street and the north line of Chapin street, a distance of line 100 feet northerly from and

The engineer's estimate of the probable cost for said improvement is \$38,076.00.

The above improvement is classed as a permanent macadam improvement and is to be maintained by the city for the period of eight years, provided that the owners of the property benefited by said improvement or any portion thereof, shall

STREET.**
