PROPOSED IMPROVEMENT OF SALMON STREET.

Notice is hereby given that at the meeting of the council of the city of Portland, Oregon, held on the 4th day of November, 1905, the following resolution was adopted:

Resolved, That the city of Portland, Oregon, decree it expedient and proper to improve Salmon street from the east end of Front street to the east end of Third street, including the street to the proper grade, paving the roadway full width with wooden blocks with sand cushion with concrete sidewalks, and to accept the cost of the intersections of First street, Second street, Third street and Fourth street.

Not in accordance to be made in accordance with the charter and ordinances of the city of Portland and the plans, specifications and estimates of the city engineer, and the report of the auditor of the city of Portland on the 21st day of October, 1905, indorsed: "City of Portland, Oregon, recommendations for the improvement of Salmon street from the east line

Front street to the east line of Fifth street, and the estimates of the work to be done and the cost thereof.

The cost of said improvement to be assessed as provided by the city charter upon the property benefited thereby, and shall be lawfully declared to be all the lots, parts of lots and parcels of land lying between a line of Front street and a line 100 feet south of the line of Salmon street and a line 100 feet south of and parallel with the south line of South Second street and the benefits thereof shall be assessed parallel with the east line of Front street and the east line of Fifth street.

The engineer's estimate of the probable total cost of the improvement of said Salmon street is \$1,585.00.

The above improvement is to be classed as a public improvement, and shall be maintained by the city of Portland for a period of twenty years, provided that the owners of a majority of the lots benefited by said improvement of any portion thereof shall not petition for a new or different improvement of the same or any portion thereof.

The plans and specifications of the estimates of the city engineer for the improvement of said Salmon street are hereby adopted.

That the City Engineer of the city of Portland be and he is hereby directed to give notice of the proposed improvement of Salmon street to the owners of the lots benefited thereby.

PROPOSED IMPROVEMENT OF MISSISSIPPI

AVENUE

Notice is hereby given that at the meeting of the Board of Commissioners of the City of Portland, Oregon, held on the 4th day of November, 1903, the following resolution was adopted:

Resolved, That the Board of the city of Portland, Oregon, deems it expedient and proper to acquire the right of way for the widening of the south line of Morris street to the south line of Prescott street in the following manner, to-wit: First—By planning the roadway for width of 100 feet, and by providing for the same, and all its intersections to the proper subgrade.

Second—By planning the roadway for width of 100 feet, and by providing for the same, with the city engineer's plans, specifications and estimates.

Third—By constructing wooden sidewalks 10 feet in width, with six-foot covering plank sidewalks, and by providing for the same, in accordance with the city engineer's plans, specifications and estimates.

And that the Board of Commissioners has caused to be provided by the city charter upon the proposition of the Board of Commissioners, that the Board is hereby declared to be all the lots, parts of lots and parcels of land lying between a line 100 feet east of the south line of Morris street and the south line of Mississippi avenue and a line 100 feet east of and parallel with the south line of Morris street, and between the south line of Prescott street and a line 100 feet south of and parallel with the south line of Morris street.

The engineer's estimate of the probable cost for the improvement of Mississippi avenue is \$15,425.

Such improvement is to be classed as a plank roadway improvement, and shall be maintained by the city for a period of four years, provided that the owners of a majority of the property benefited by the improvement, or any different improvement before the expiration of such period.

The plans, specifications and estimates of the engineer for the improvement of said Mississippi avenue are hereby adopted.

Resolved, That the auditor of the city of

Portland be and he is hereby directed to give effect to the proposed improvement of said Mississippi avenue as provided by the city charter.
