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"JIM HAM" LEWIS OF MATCH MAKING FAME

Tacoma, Wash., Nov. 21.—James Hamilton Lewis says he will forfeit his license as a lawyer if his statements regarding the affairs of the Washington Match company of this city are not true.

The former Democratic congressman has filed his answer in the federal court covering the charges made by the defendants in the receivership case.

The receiver, Frank B. Cole, was appointed upon Mr. Lewis' application, but the officers of the company have protested against the appointment.

Colonel Lewis says in his answer, which covers 14 typewritten pages, that he never got one dollar of the company's money or property.

He states that his application for a receivership was caused by the confusion into which the company's affairs had fallen after he resigned as president in October, 1902.

In a brief filed by his attorneys, "Jim Ham" Lewis goes on record as being willing to forfeit his license as an attorney if the defendants' charges are true.

Frank Westfall, who was brought back from San Francisco on a charge of embezzling \$45 from his employer, and whose name is on the list of defendants, has pleaded guilty.
