SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 1.

Resolved by the senate, the house concurring.
That the following article, as an amendment to the constitution of the state of Oregon, be proposed and referred to the next legislative assembly, and if the same shall be concurred in by a majority of all the members elected to each house thereof, and shall afterwards be ratified by a majority of the electors of the state, then the same shall be a part of the crestitution of the state of oregon:

Article 1. That article xix, section 1, of the constitution of the state of oregon, be and the same is hereby abrogated, and in lieu thereof shall be inserted the following:

The legislative assembly of the state of Oregon is hereby empowered to provide by law for the election of a state printer, to provide for his compensation, and to prescribe his powers and duties.
