CORPORATION WOULD TAKE OVER WORK

The state commission of the Lewis and Clark exposition at its meeting tomorrow will consider among other things a communication from the corporation.

The corporation asks that the commission approve plans for state buildings on the 1905 fair site, that the corporation carry out these plans by advertising for bids and selecting the lowest and best estimate and by generally taking from the state commission the trouble of seeing that the plans are correctly carried out, the corporation to be repaid by the commission from state funds. Members of the state commission refuse to discuss the proposal, but will act on it tomorrow.
