PROPOSALS FOR IMPROVEMENT BONDS

CITY OF PORTLAND, OR. Sealed proposals will be received by the auditor of the city of Portland, Or., until Monday, January 18, 1904, at 4 o'clock p. m. for the improvement of streets and laying of sewers in incorporated cities, and for the payment of the cost of such improvements by installments, as amended by an act of the legislature of the state of Oregon, approved February 28, 1893, and an act of the legislature of the state of Oregon, approved February 22, 1895, and the proceeds thereof to be used for the payment of bonds for the improvement of streets or construction of sewers as the said improvements shall be determined.

The validity of the act of the legislature aforesaid has been affirmed by the supreme court of the state of Oregon.

Bidders will be required to submit a flat bid, without conditions, except as to the regularity of the issue of bonds, and to deposit with each bid a certified check on a bank in the city of Portland, Or., equal to 5 per cent of the value of the bonds to be issued.

PROPOSED IMPROVEMENT OF LEO AVENUE

Notice is hereby given that at the meeting of the council of the city of Portland, Or., held on the 16th day of December, 1903, the following resolution was adopted:

Resolved, That the city engineer, or his assistant, do cause to be laid out and improved the street of Leo Avenue from the west line of East Third Street to the east line of East Thirtieth Street, in the following manner, to-wit:

First—By grading the street full width with all intersections to proper subgrade.

Second—By laying wooden sidewalks in accordance with the city engineer's plans, specifications and estimates.

Third—By laying wooden crosswalks in accordance with the city engineer's plans, specifications and estimates.

Fourth—By constructing the gutters in accordance with the city engineer's plans, specifications and estimates.

Fifth—By bringing the surface of the street to the grade of the street in width in the center of the street with gravel.

Said improvement to be made in accordance with the charter and ordinances of the city of Portland and the plans, specifications and estimates of the city engineer, filed in the office of the auditor of the city of Portland on the 15th day of December, 1903, and approved by the council of the city of Portland on the 16th day of December, 1903, and the city engineer, or his assistant, do cause to be laid out and improved the street of Leo Avenue from the west line of East Third Street to the east line of East Thirtieth Street, in the following manner, to-wit:
