SPONANE'S MINISTERIAL ASSOCIA TION SETS MATTERS BY THE EARS AND SEVERAL WEALTEY MEN COME INTO COURT CHARGED WITH RENTING PREMISES.

(Journal Special Service.) Spokane, Wash., Jan. 25 .- Along with ommon drunks Spokane's reputed dive owners were arraigned in the police court late Saturday afternoon. The were arrested on warrants sworn out by L. S. Streyffeler who represents the Ministerial association. Besides the prisoners and complaining witness a delegation of ministers were in the court room to watch the preceedings. The name of J. D. Finley was called first and he took the prisoner's chair

with a smile and pleaded "not guilty" after hearing the charge. Attorney S. A. Wells appeared for the defendant and the case was set for Thursday afternoon of this week. J. D. Finley is semember of the lumber brokerage firm of Finley & Pratt, with offices on the fifth floor of the Empire State building. He is also a trustee of the Fourth Presbyterian church. His part-

er is one of the city aldermen.
R. T. Daniel was called next and he waived the reading of the complaint and pleaded not guilty as did each of the men. The cases were all set for Thursday afternoon. R. T. Daniel is a man of considerable wealth and is the owner of the building which was for many years occupied by the Owl sa-loon and gambling parlors operated by Doc Brown, now of Portland. Frank Bruno, an Italian poolroom proprietor was the third in line. He had no attorney and his case went over like the Anthony Barone, a saloonkeeper, and Eugene Aitken, also a saloonkeeper, were the next in line and their cases met the same fate. "Dutch Jake" Goetz and Harry Baer met the same fate. These two men are the owners of the famous Coeur d'Alene theatre in this The men were all released on their recognizance. In all cases the violation of the law was alleged to have occurred on December 9. The warrant for Jerome Drumheller of the firm of Drumheller & Malloy, insurance and real estate brokers, was returned unsatisfied as Drumheller is at present in New York on business. A warrant for Charles Crosby has not yet been served. That individual cannot be located and it is supposed that possibly the name is only a dummy used to protect some other person. One John Doe warrant remains unserved and it is not known who the ministers are after with it.

They Will Fight. A determined fight will be made by all the men. It is reported that the con-stitutionality of the law will be tested and some of the men will allege that they have sold the property, and others that they rented it for lodging house purposes, and that they cannot prevent

the lessees from using it for whatever purpose they desire. The complaints were drawn upon in-formation obtained from the records at the courthouse and real estate maps bearing the names of different owners of downtown property. The evidence includes the police records, showing that the women occupying the rooms pleaded guilty in the police court of living lives of immorality and paid fines assessed
