The city council is evidently determined to exercise a much more rigorous super-vision of the expenses in the various municipal departments than it has in the past, as was evidenced at the monthly session of the health board yesterday. The question of estimated expenditures dur-ing February came up for discussion and City Auditor, Devlin stated that the expenditures could not exceed the estimate by one penny. "I have been instructed," he explained to the board, "not to audit a cent's worth of accounts in excess of the estimate you furnish at the beginning of the month.

This means a much more careful survey of probable expenditures hereafter. Every bill, from pens to groceries for the inmates at the pesthouse, must be reckoned out to the cent. If the board runs short there will be no remedy, and if the actual expenses do not eat up the estimate appropriated the residue cannot go

on next month's bills. But the city auditor announced further that the health board had not been picked out specially for such consideration at the hands of the council. The same rule will apply to all departments and is to be strictly enforced. The city engineer, the city treasurer, the city auditor, the pound department, the harbor-master, all are to be kept up to the notch on the matter of expenses.

No open mention was made of the longdelayed receiving hospital, but the bills that were audited for the care of patients sent to the private hospitals would make good the claim that the city would be the gainer financially if a receiving or emergency hospital were established. City Physician Zan is still hopeful that room will be secured in the jail building for that purpose, but so far Chief of Police Hunt has not seemed to be able to provide quarters for that purpose.




