

SEE YOUR NAME IS ON THE JURY LIST FOR 1904

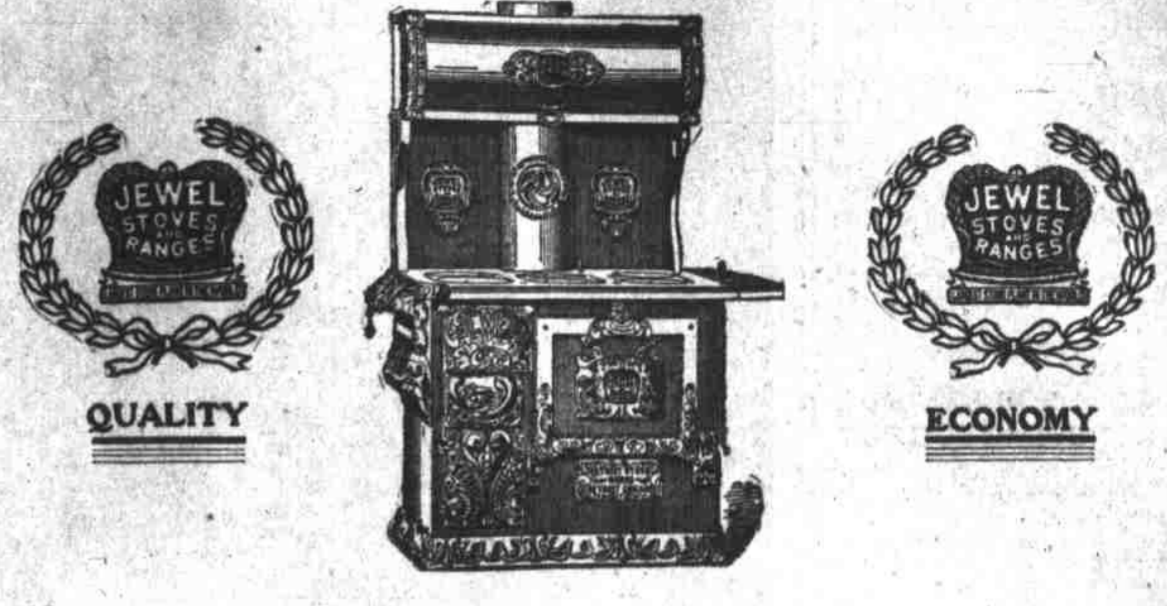
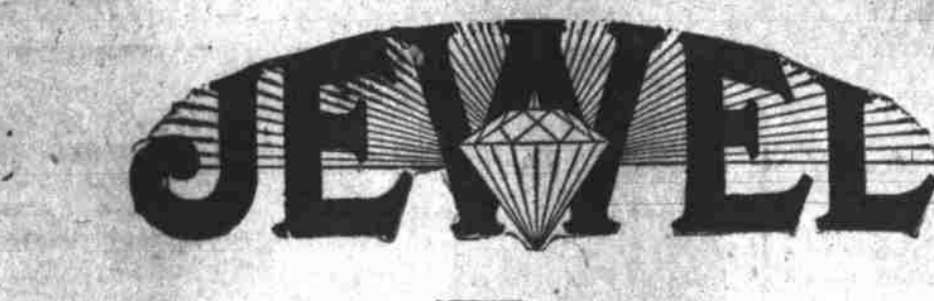
