RMINAL COMPANY GIVES CITY PERPETUAL LEAVE OF AMPLE PIECE OF GROUND-NEW HOUSE MAY BE BUILT OF BRICK WITH HANDSOME FRONT.

One of the most important additions to the equipment of the local fire department will be a new engine company near the Union depot, provision for which has just been made by the city council and executive board.

As pointed out by The Journal months ago the vicinity of the depot is an excellent location for an engine company. The surrounding territory contains many manufacturing establishments. There are miles of river front to protect and there is practically no fire protection under present conditions.

The terminal company has offered the city a lot, 48 by 70 feet, on the east side of Fifth street between Hoyt and Irving streets. On this lot the new fire quarters will be built and within four onths Engine company 2 should be in service.

The company will have an extra. first size metropolitan steamer with a capacity of 1,100 gallons of water a minute. It is the same as engines 1 and 3 now in service. The steamer is now nearing completion in an eastern factory. To run with it a hose wagon will be built, the contract for which will shortly be The company will be manned by 10 The wagon will carry a small extension ladder.

The contract for the new building will be awarded shortly; and as the terminal company has evinced its good intention by giving the city a perpetual lease on the ground, it has been suggested that the new station should be the best and most substantial in the city. Portland's fire houses are said to be far behind those of other cities. Large cities invariably build their own engine houses of brick, and it is pointed out that pressed brick building should be erected here near the depot. Another consideration is that all new arrivals will see this house and a substantial building of brick would give them a good impression of Portland. It is also suggested that the house be made double so that in the future, if thought expedient, a truck company or a chemical could be quar-

tered in the same building.
As The Journal stated, the new company will cover a large area hitherto al-most without fire service. Engine 2 will answer all alarms through the north end, covering the tenderloin district, the water front for many blocks and the vicinity of the terminal grounds. It will also be close to the sawmilis along the also be close to the sawmilis along the north river front, while it will answer first alarm calls from the hospital and residence districts. For second alarms it will be needed in the heart of the city, and will be close to respond to calls from Albina and other east side districts.
