The trouble is American ship owners are not willing to carry freight as cheaply as those of other countries. The Frye bill gives them a monopoly and then they can charge such rates as they please. Extending the time to January 1, 1905, will not help the matter. Even if there should be an increase in the number of American vessels as a result of this law there cannot be many vessels built in that time, not nough to afford any relief. Everything will be lost and there is nothing to gain by adopting this measure. The Pacific coast in particular will suffer, though the whole country will be affected. The producer always bears the burden of all these protective measures and why he will stand it is a mystery to me, but he has borne it so long he is used to it and takes it as a matter of course, I pre-
