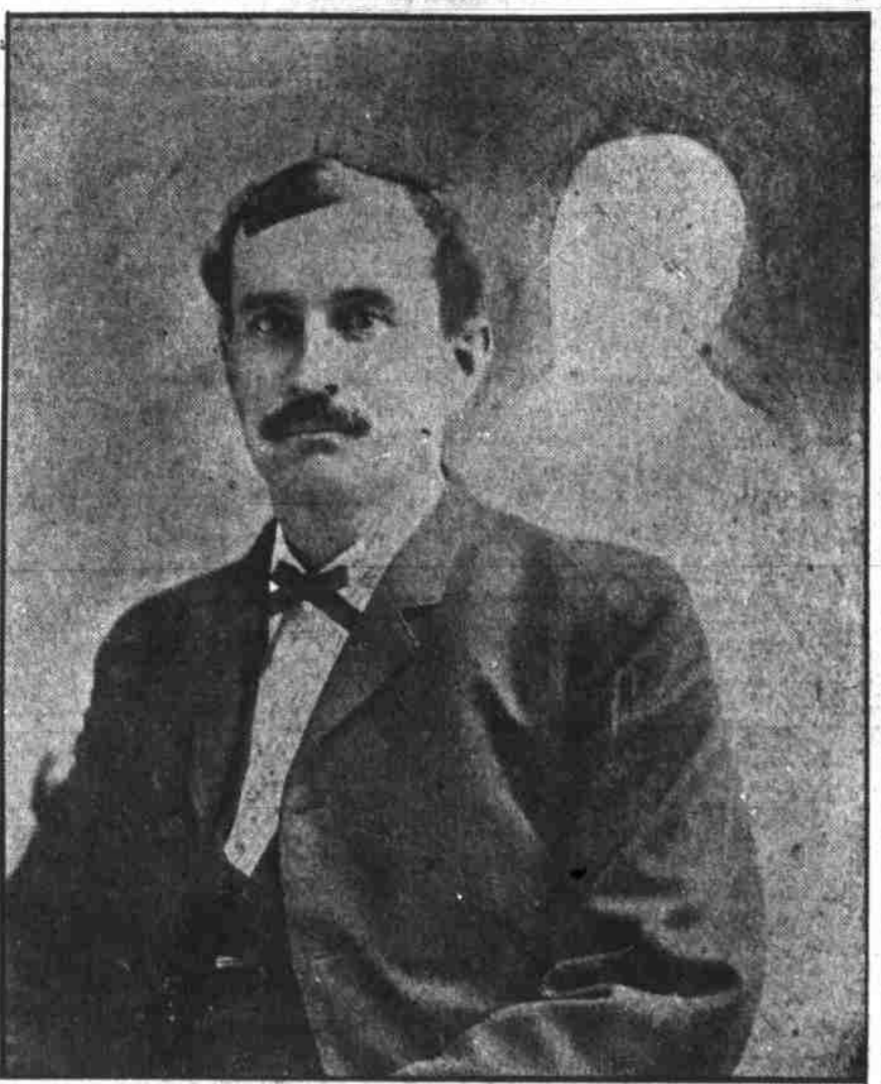


PRAYS FOR RICH SISTER TO SAVE HIM FROM POVERTY

BUILDING LAW IS COMPLETED

Features of the new measure proposed for Portland's use—other acts to govern terrace construction and inspection of buildings.

After several months of toil the committee in charge of the drafting of a new building ordinance has brought its work up to the point where copies of the proposed ordinance are completed...

"The building ordinance now before the city council," said Otto Klemm, secretary of the Architects' association...

The vital sections of the new ordinance are as follows: To Test Materials. Section 26. Material hereafter introduced in this market shall be subjected to such tests to determine its character and quality...

Section 71—All brick, stone, iron or frame buildings shall have permanent means of access to the roof from the inside.

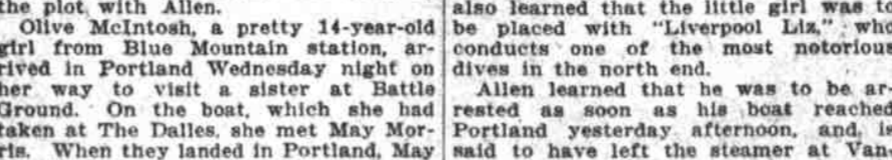
Section 72—Nothing in this ordinance shall be so construed as to apply to, or prevent the erection of what are known as grain elevators...

Subdivision D—No temporary staging of any kind, nor stand for observation purposes shall be constructed of wood upon the roof of any building.

Section 102—Nothing in this ordinance shall be so construed as to apply to, or prevent the erection of what are known as grain elevators...
