From the St. Louis Republic. Cardinal Gibbons, in a recent sermon, sald: "We need men who are controlled by conscience rather than by expediency -men who are influenced by a sense of duty and not by self-interest, who are swayed by a spirit of patriotism and not by a desire of political preferment."

In the pulpit, gen-erally speaking, the high salary and carefully selected sermons are of more importance than spreading the homely gospel of Nazareth.

The time may come when we shall have only such men of whom Cardinal

Gibbons speaks, but it is evident all around us that the time is far away.




