

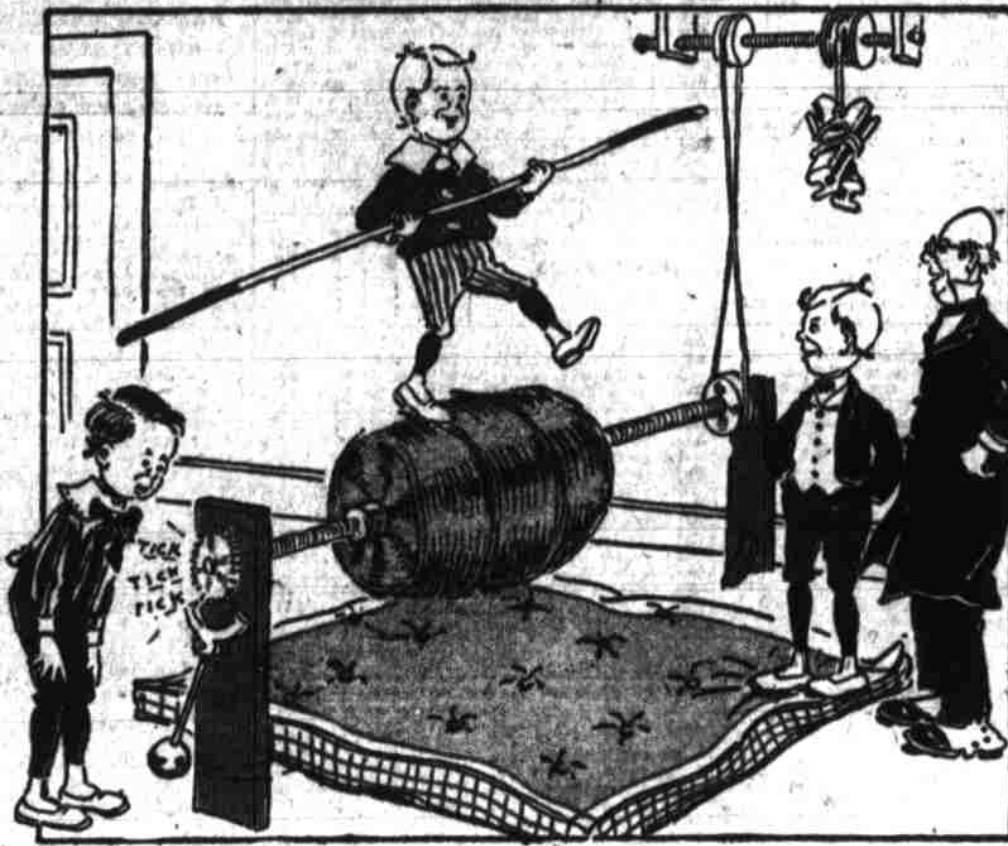

WILLIE WESTINGHOUSE MAKES AN ADDITION TO THE SCHOOL GYMNASIUM



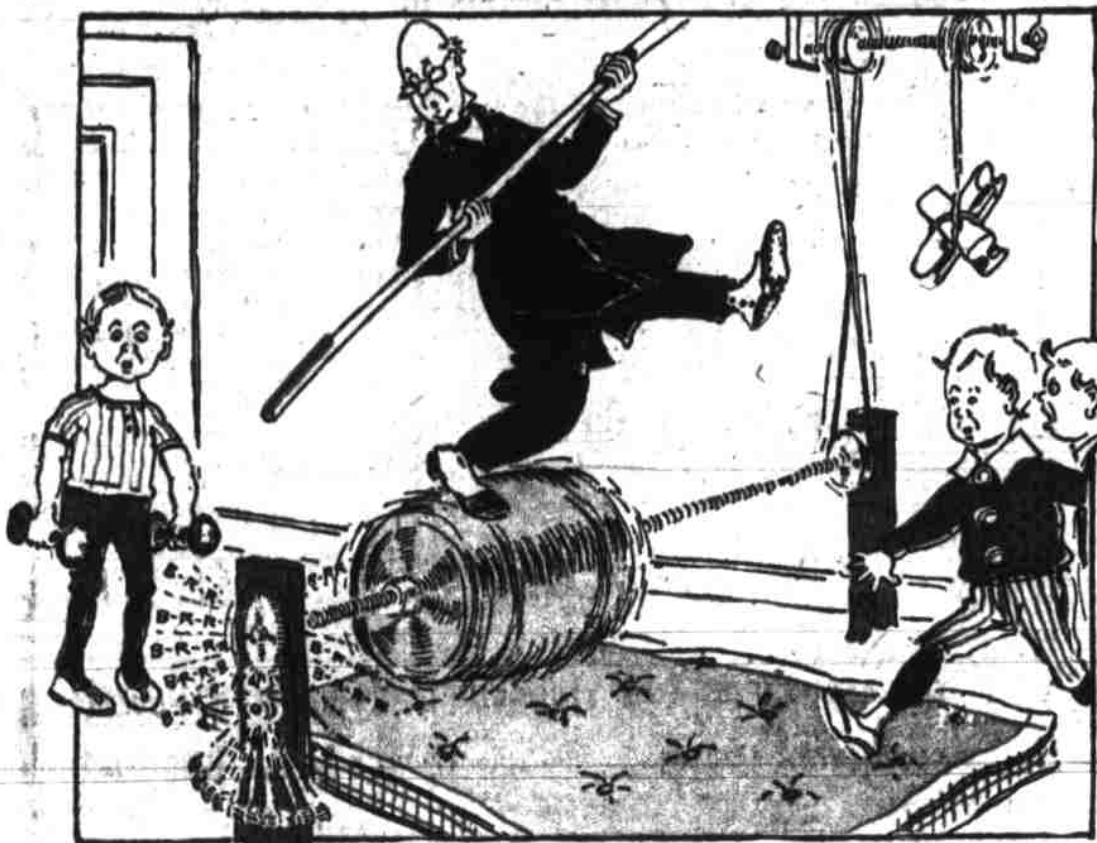
Dear Tommy: We have a gymnasium at school, but they only have a few dumbbells and things—



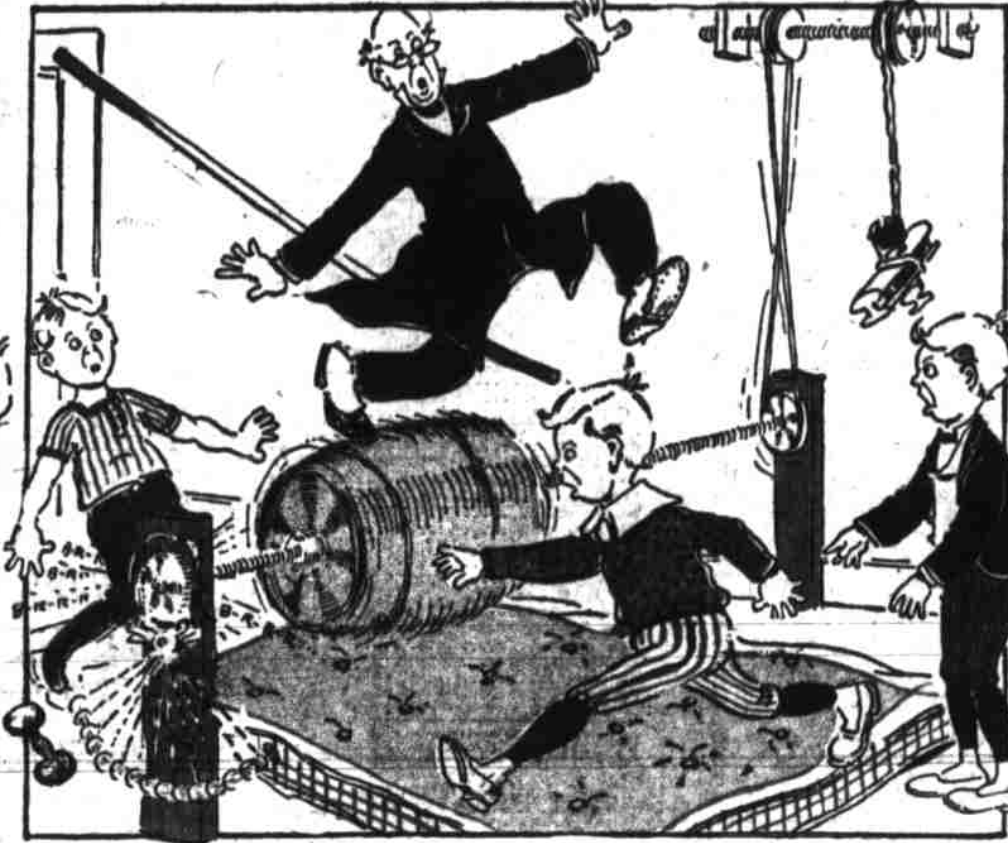
So I built an exerciser for the leg muscles. Teacher got interested in it and wanted to try it.

Say, Tommy, if it hadn't been for the mattress the teacher would have been jarred worse than he was. Yours, Willie

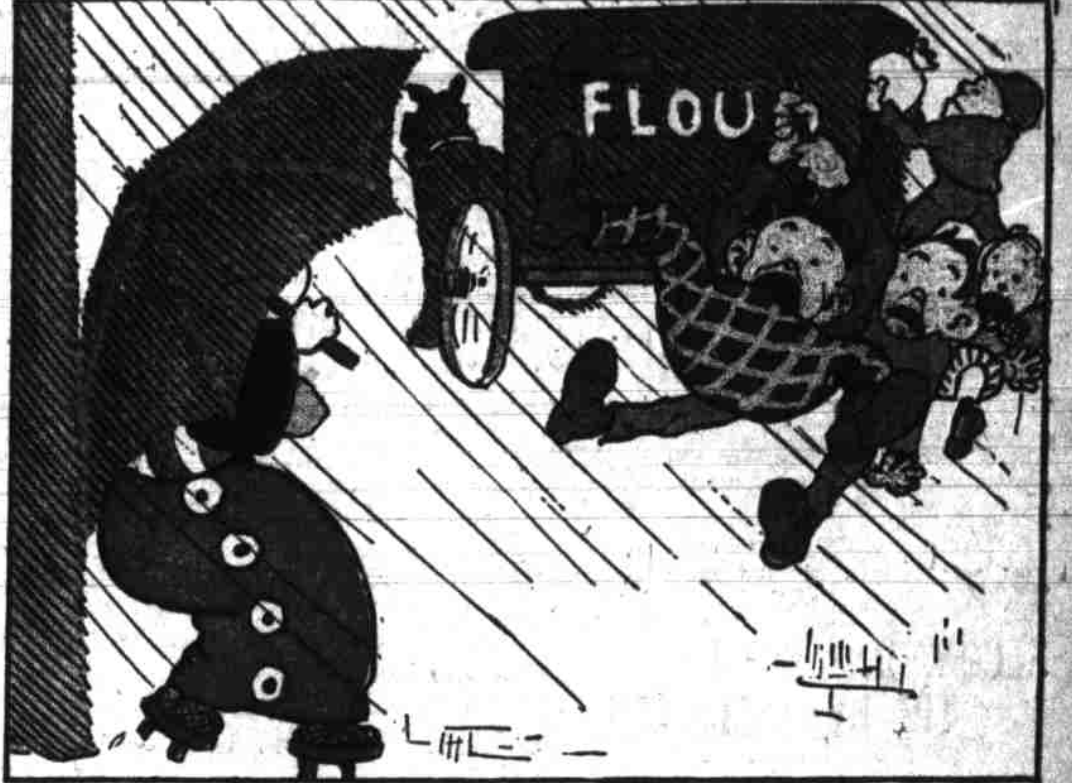

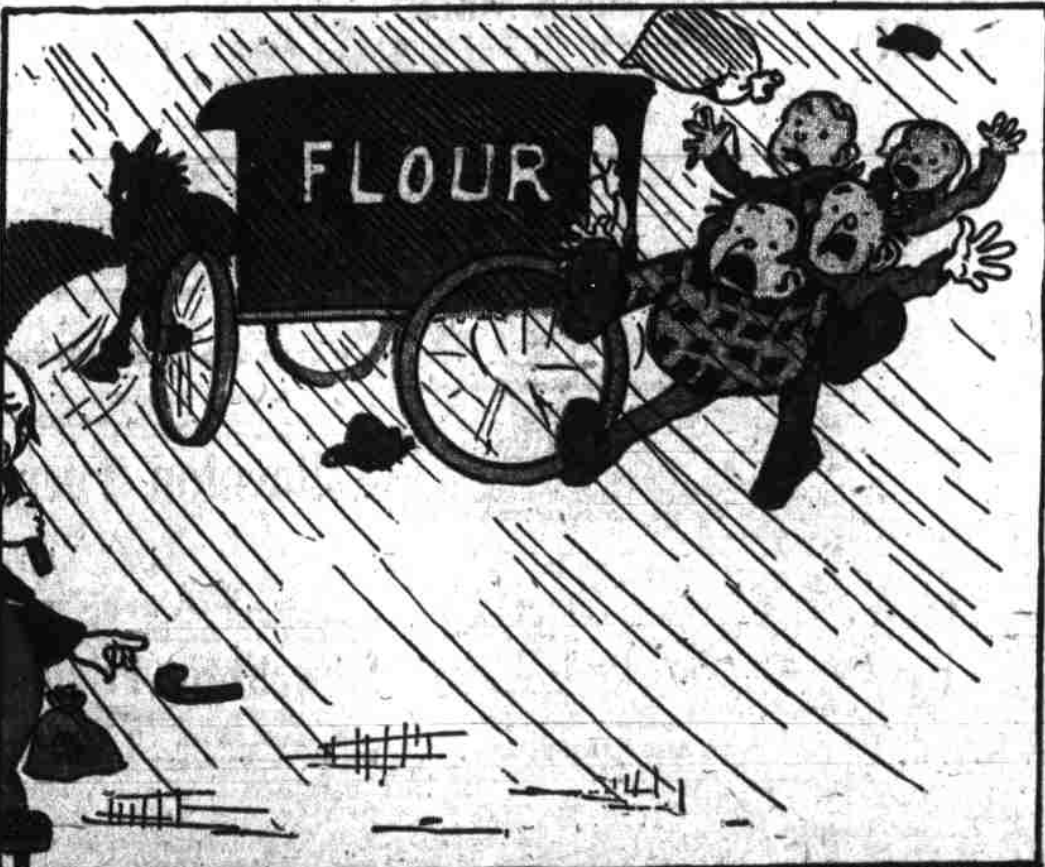

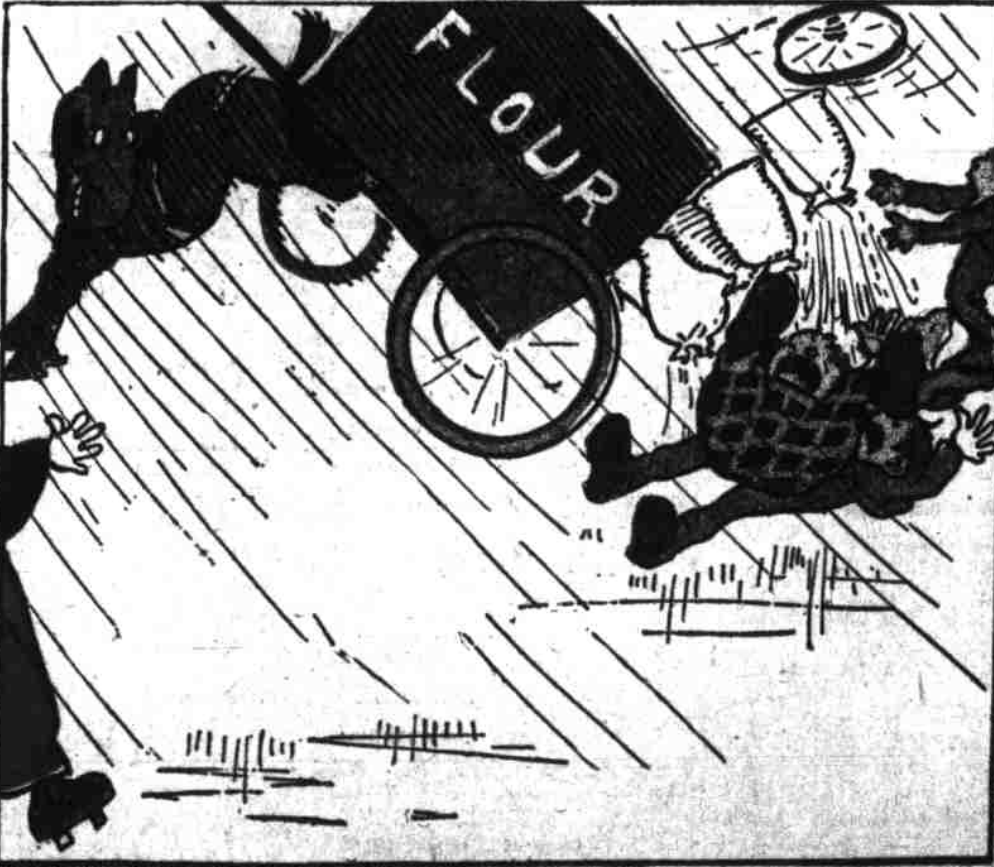
But then they didn't know that the umbrella has a patent handle—



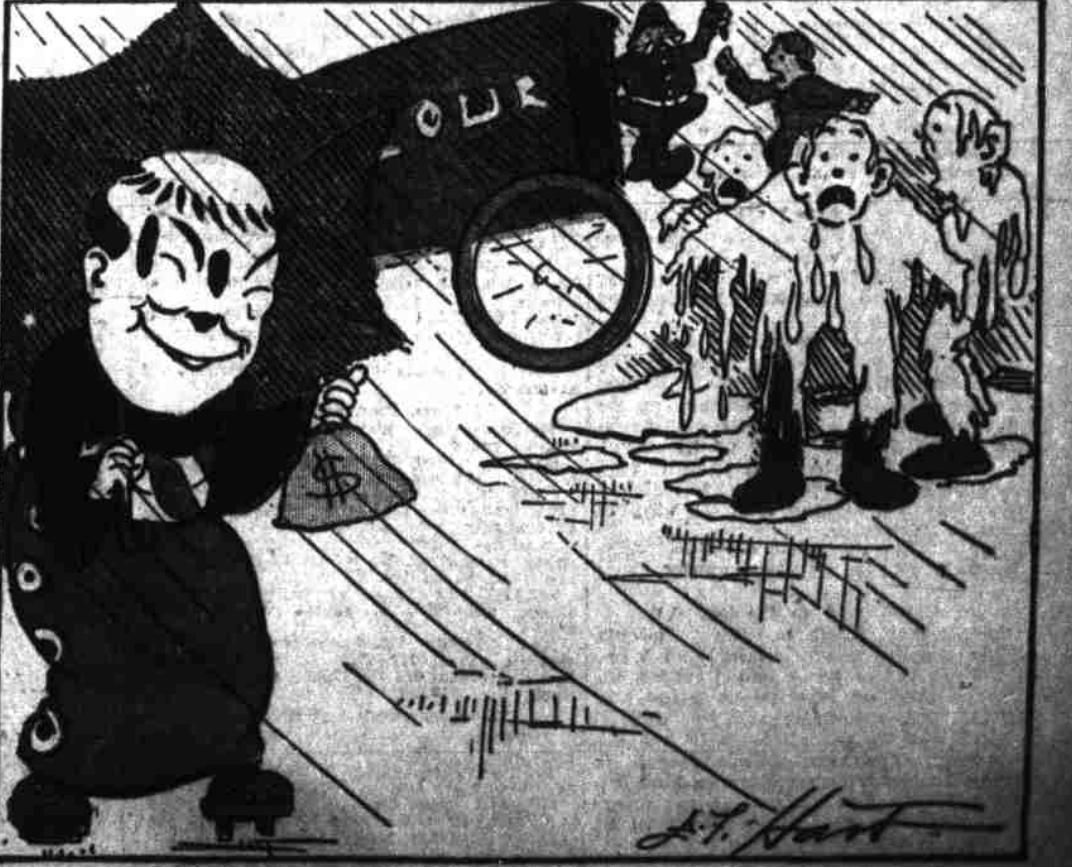
Which comes off with so much disturbance that—
