

UNIONS OPPOSE LOCAL OPTION LAW

DISARMERS HAVE SELECTED
REPRESENTATIVES OF OTHER
CRAFTS IN A CRUSADE AGAINST
LIQUOR BILL—SECRETARY JOHN
WALKER PLAINLY.

Committees from the cooper's, brewer's, bartenders' and beer bottlers' unions have been appointed, at the instigation of the cigar men to prepare letters and forward to the various unions throughout the state, and tradesmen in all lines will be asked to oppose the bill.

"If the bill should become a law," says J. W. Jones, secretary of the cigar-makers' union, "it will mean a very material decrease in our membership and an increase in the sale of 'scab' cigars. As a rule, the saloon men are very friendly to the labor movement, and to a great extent they handle nothing but union-made cigars. Lessen the number of saloons, and the supply of blue-label goods will be correspondingly diminished."

Careful estimates made in the large cities show that there is one cigar-maker for every saloon license issued. It has also been shown in those states where local option has been tried that the cigar trade has suffered in an equal degree to that of the saloon business. Many of our craftsmen know this to be true from actual experience—they have been forced to go elsewhere in order to make a living.

"But the cigar-makers and saloon men will not be the only sufferers by the passage of such a bill. It will affect the laundry workers to no small degree. Saloons are good patrons of laundries. Close some of the former and it must necessarily follow that a number of the latter will be forced out of business. Any injury done on the one side, the other, it does not require the patronage of many saloons to keep a modern laundry plant running to its full capacity."

"While many bartenders, brewers, cooper's and beer bottlers would be thrown out of employment, the enactment of the proposed measure into a law would affect all trades to a certain extent. Many cooks, waiters, and bakers would be obliged to seek work elsewhere. This is not a mere theory, but a fact, which has been fully demonstrated, and it behooves organized labor to take up the fight in earnest against the proposed measure."

This Resolution Was Adopted: Whereas, The passage of a local option law in the state of Oregon would prove to be inimical to the best interests of the commercial and industrial conditions of the state; and

Whereas, By the passage of such a measure it would disorganize the unions of the brewery workmen more than 50 per cent, and throw over half of our members out of employment, besides affecting the excellent standing of many of the other crafts; therefore, be it resolved, That the Beer Drivers' and Bottlers' union, No. 301, and the Brewers' union, No. 320, in regular meeting assembled, record themselves as unalterably opposed to local option of any other form of similar prohibition in the state of Oregon, and pledge themselves to do our utmost to defeat the measure, and ask the assistance of our friends in and out of the trades union movement to aid us in every way they consistently can to preserve our calling and craft.
