

TACOMA'S PLOT AROUSES SEATTLE

OUND CRIES WAR OVER TRADE OF VASHON AND MAURY ISLANDS

—TROUBLE ARRISES OVER A BRIDGE—FARMERS WANT IT LEFT WHERE IT IS—WANTS BRIDGE.

Seattle, May 21.—Tacoma and Seattle are warring over the trade of Vashon and Maury islands, lying half way between the two cities in Puget sound. Tacoma seeks to get the trade, Seattle to hold it. And the trouble all arises over a bridge between the two islands. Quietly certain influences have been at work to change this bridge to make the Tacoma wharf the nearer and more convenient for the farmers.
