

## LONE BANDIT ROBS SILVER CITY STAGE

(Special Dispatch to the Journal)

Nampa, Id., June 23.—The stage from Silver City to this place was held up about two miles north of Silver City yesterday by a lone highwayman who, the mail bags rifled and the passengers to the number of nine relieved of their valuables. The robber was armed with a shotgun, and after halting the stage he ordered the passengers and driver to alight and lined them up by the roadside. At this juncture a man and his wife, residents of Silver City, drove up, and they, too, were forced to join the passengers from the stage and relieved of their purse.

Just as the robber completed his work with the passengers, a man from the direction of DeLamar, rode up on horseback. He was forced to dismount and cut open the mail pouches, which the thief then ranacked.

The robber was a small man, and wore a black mask. It is not thought that he secured more than \$50 in cash. A posse is scouring the woods for the bandit, but so far no trace has been found.
