PLENTY OF TIME TO GET A SALMON

FALLING RIVER MAY HELP SALMON

MORE FISH IS NOW COMING THAN AT ANY TIME DURING PRESENT SEASON—CATCH UP TO DATE SMALLER THAN PREVIOUS YEAR—PRICES ARE LOWER.

Front Street, July 7.—The principal features of the Portland salmon market today are: Sugar meat very firm; Beef not so firm; Hogs and veal in good call; Fall Oregon potatoes and apricots; Egg market is stiffer at prices.

Salmon Is More Plentiful. In the local markets more salmon is now arriving than at any time during the present season and the prices are shaded about to a point lower than they were at the same time last year.

May Be a Fair Season. Although up to this time the catch of salmon in the Columbia river has been rather light, the season is now increasing and the catches are working longer times.

With the larger catch of halibut there was a cut of about ten a pound in the wholesale quotations today. The van of Columbia river salt is closing very fast, what few fish now coming being of very poor quality.

With the opening of the canning season the market on sugar has firming up a trifle and some of the wholesalers are again predicting an advance in the price of sugar.

The salt market continues at the low quotations and there are no prospects of an immediate settlement of the differences of the refiners. Business in salt is only normal.

First Oregon Peaches and Apricots. The first Oregon peaches and apricots for this season arrived in this city late yesterday afternoon and found a very good sale at prices about the same as last year.

Dealers Cry for Hogs and Veal. There is a general scarcity of good veal and hogs in the local market and all dealers are sending out announcements asking for larger shipments.
