Front Street, July 13.—The principal feature of the Portland wholesale market today was the advance in the price of old potatoes. The price of old potatoes advanced from 10c to 12c per bushel.

Old Potatoes Seek Higher Level: Old potatoes selling at \$1.25 per hundred bushels in the Portland wholesale market.

There is a decided scarcity of both veal and lamb in the Portland market. The price of veal has advanced from 10c to 12c per pound.

There is still a good feeling in the egg market with quotations hanging close to the mark. Receipts continue liberal enough to supply the demand with a large part of the stocks graded 100 percent.
